

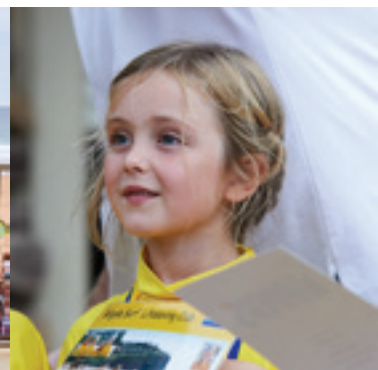

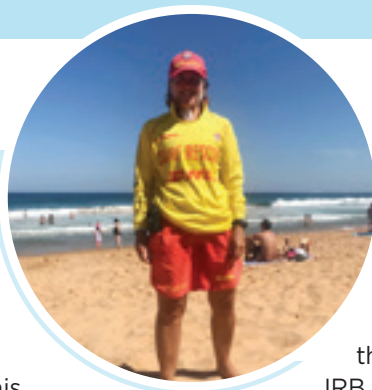


PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season 2018/19 at Bilgola SLSC had a bittersweet edge for me. On the surf life saving side, we had a stellar season involving strong participation from our volunteer life savers, with no major surf incidents. Sadly, early this year we experienced two critical incidents at Bilgola Beach. Both involved club members acting as first responders.

Overall the club has performed well across many measures including good management by our committees, financial stability, stable membership and the maintenance of a 'family-friendly' welcoming club, all with the aim of ensuring a safe beach, engaged members and enthused juniors.

All our Lifesavers put in a sterling effort this year. An example of the skill of our volunteers was recognised in November, when 19-year-old Cameron Scully (Patrol 10) was acknowledged for his involvement at an incident on McCarrs Creek Road on October 1 by being awarded the SLSSNB Rescue of the month. Our volunteer lifesavers spend hours both training and patrolling. We have 12 patrols, many made up of friends, mates and families. They display the true meaning of wearing the red and yellow, in their approach and professionalism. This includes many of our teenage and young adults, who continue



to impress me with their maturity and ability to respond to a situation quickly and with a degree of calmness belie their age.

Our training has been strong this year with over 30 new Bronze Medallion candidates, many who have come through the Nipper ranks. Several new IRB crew and drivers passed their assessment this year as well as 16 new SRC (Surf Rescue Certificate) cadets. Many of our SRCs have been active in water safety throughout the Nipper season. Recognising the efforts of our Trainers Pete Fenley, Kaz Marks, Rowan Jacob, David Madew, Rob Farr, Marc Bernard and Craig Poppleton.

We had another wonderful Nippers Season. Highlights included the spectacular entrance of Santa at Nippers last Christmas, seeing once "surf shy" Nippers rounding the buoy in the swim or board

for the first time. The development of their skills can only be achieved through the continued support of our dedicated Age Managers and assistants and by the continued involvement of our Nipper parents to assist us getting large numbers through the activities. The Junior committee led by Karen Muxworthy, continue to ensure fun activities, engaged parents and amazingly supportive Nipper Age Managers and Assistants, who we recognise for the hours they volunteer.

In January we held the Blackmores Billy Ocean Swim. Despite a roaring Southerly, every part of the Swim ran impeccably and reflected the spirit and depth of our Club. Our Swim Director, David Madew, said "It made me proud to watch the Club work as one to create such a great event - I cannot praise every volunteer highly enough."

The critical incidents at Bilgola Beach were understandably felt across our club and the community. It is important to acknowledge our Caretaker and ALS Lifeguard, several club members who were on hand to lend support and our Club Coordinator who supported many during this period. During this period, we received welcomed support and advice from SLSNSW CEO Steve Pearce, SLSSNB CEO Steve McInnes, local NSW State Member, Rob Stokes, our Mayor, Michael Regan and his team at Northern Beaches Council and Police Commander, Northern Beaches Local Area, Dave Darcy. We were also introduced to wonderful and supportive organisations Avalon Youth Hub, The Burdekin Association and Community Care Northern Beaches (CCNB). All the Bilgola members involved were recognised at our presentation evening with the Lifesaving Acknowledgement award.

Our Boat crews had a stellar season including at the Bilgola Surf Boat carnival (Round 1 of the SNB Surf Boat Premiership), where there were over 50 crews entered, which meant we played host to over 300 rowers, officials and spectators. The results for our crew were excellent, the Masters men were first, U23 women second and Reserve men fourth.

Continuing into the season our rowers were successful including at the SNBSLS branch titles where the Masters Bilgola Old won the 200 division, Bilgola Bends won the 140 division and the Bilgola Rippers under 23 female crew claimed gold in their division. At the NSW State titles, the Bilgola Old crew claimed a silver medal. Then Bilgola won two GOLDS at Aussies, the first by our Bilgola Old 200yrs Masters Men and the second the 140Years Men's crew. Congratulations to our U23 Women's Bilgola Rippers who won the Don McManus trophy and our Bilgola Bends who won the Bill "Woofa" Barnett trophy for SNB boat premiership at the recent Branch Awards of Excellence.

Well done Steve Faddy who was also recognised with the Support Services Award at the recent Branch Awards of Excellence.

Our Presentation evening provided us with the opportunity to acknowledge those who have gone above and beyond in their volunteering efforts.

This year David Madew developed the Sunday Sessions initiative, opening the club up nearly every Sunday afternoon during the season to members and the community to enjoy music by local performers. Acknowledging our Bar Manager, Margaret Perrin for her support of Sunday Sessions. This is part of our approach to ensure the club is accessible to all in the community.

Our club is the success it is due to the contributions from our members especially those on our Senior and Junior Committees, I acknowledge the time and commitment they give the club.

This year three Bilgola SLSC members were recognised with Australian Honours. President Romilly Madew received an Order of Australia (AO) award in honour of her distinguished service to the construction sector as a change agent and advocate for sustainable building practices. Lucinda Brogden received a Awarded Member (AM) in the General Division for significant service to workplace mental health and wellbeing. Awarded Medal (OAM) in the General Division, Mr Michael Bartlett for service to surf lifesaving.

Thank you also to our many sponsors including Blackmores, Northern Beaches Council, Adrenalin, Avalon Meats, Harris Farm Markets Mona Vale, Amber Waves Bakery, Royal Motor Yacht Club, United Resource Management (URM) and Zubi at Billy's and a big welcome to our new Nippers sponsor Ray White Prestige Palm Beach.

As this is my last season as President, I want to especially acknowledge those who have supported me over the past six seasons through attending our events, providing advice and guiding me. From our local politicians Jason Falinski, Rob Stokes, Michael Regan and Kylie Ferguson, to our Patrons Marcus Blackmore and his wife Caroline and John Brogden AM and his wife Lucy Brogden AM, to Life Members Graham Foran, Bob Machar, Steve Broughton-Rouse and David Lyall. From the SLS fraternity, thank you to the Steves, both Steve Pearce and Steve McInnes. To my husband David, who decided to join me by firstly getting his Bronze, then his IRB credentials and finally joining the committee. To the Committee both past and present - what a great group of people you are. I am in awe of the time and effort you make on top of everything else you do. And finally to our Club Coordinator, Kylie Ockwell, thank you for your awesomeness, you are our first point of contact and represent the club in such a welcoming manner. Kylie was acknowledged at our Awards receiving the Most Valued Person of the Year - Ross Hennessy Trophy.

I leave the role as President knowing our club is in an excellent position. We practice good governance, are in a strong financial position and have maintained our membership levels. But most importantly, the health of our club is reflected in the welcoming atmosphere when both members and friends come together at Bilgola.

TREASURER'S REPORT

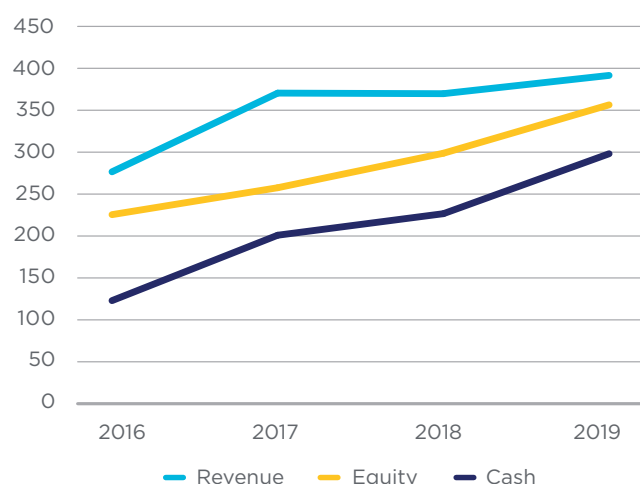
The executive committee continues to strive to maintain and enhance the club's facilities and cannot do so without the generous support of all our members, the community and local authorities during our various fund raising events and club activities held throughout the year.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Revenues generated in 2019 were \$391,983 (2018: \$370,393). From the \$391,983 in revenue earned the club has spent \$334,797 (2018: \$329,626) across various club activities including upgrading and maintaining equipment and the facilities enjoyed by members. The end result for the year saw a profit of \$57,186 (2018: \$40,768). The retained earnings of the club is \$357,159 (2018: \$299,973). The club's cash position has been strengthened during the year with cash deposits at the end of the financial year being \$297,875 (2018: \$226,916).

A major focus of the committee in recent years has been on growing our revenue, equity and cash position. The below chart highlights our revenues, equity position and cash position over the last four financial years.

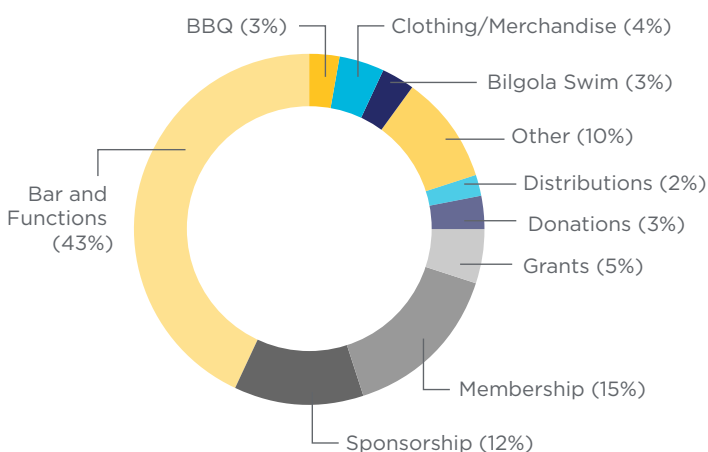
Key Financial Trends (000's)



All of the key metrics reflected in the graph above are trending upwards. From 2016 revenue has grown by 41%, equity 57% and cash 138%. The below graph highlights where the club generated its revenues from in the 2019 financial year.

The revenues highlighted in the following graph and the financial results for the year ended 31 May 2019 recorded in the Income Statement show continued strength in income derived from memberships, functions and our major fund raising events.

Core Revenue Streams



Recent years has seen the committee focus on growing and diversifying the clubs revenue streams. There has been a particular focus on bar and functions revenue. This focus has seen the revenue generated from functions increase from \$74k in 2016 to \$168k in 2019, a 128% increase. These pleasing results have put the club in a strong financial position that will allow us to invest in equipment and clubhouse facility upgrades in the coming years.

INCOME

Our revenue base for funding our expenditure primarily came from Bar and functions, membership subscriptions, sponsorship, donations, grants and fund raising activities such as the Bilgola swim. Revenue this year was \$391,983 which is 6% above 2018 levels. Whilst there has been some fluctuations in some of our revenue streams the majority have remained relatively consistent with 2018.

Our major sponsor Blackmores have continued their generous support providing funding for many upgrades to the clubs operational activities including the ongoing assistance to our Nippers program, surf boat sponsorship, beach safety, clubhouse maintenance and life saving equipment.

Our major fundraising events, the Bilgola swim along with our regular Sunday sessions, sippers and nippers BBQ were once again well supported by our local community, business and members. All these

events are as important as each other in relieving the financial burden of funding the clubs activities.

The focus on events like the Sunday sessions not only contributes valuable revenue to the club it also assists in fostering a sense of community within the club and provides opportunities to grow our membership base. Costs for the Bilgola swim were just below the revenue generated in 2019. This is due to a number of large one of expense items that were incurred. These items will be used in future years.

Donations are very special to us and provide a personal way for members and non-members to support the club. This year we again received income from the trust fund bequeathed to the club by our past long-standing member Bob De Groot. No matter how large or small the donations we receive every dollar does indeed help, so again we thank all our donors for their continued support. Donations are also tax deductible due to the club being a non-profit organisation with "Deductible Gift Recipient" status.

During 2019 a number of grants were received. These grants were received from organisations such as Surf Life Saving Australia, Northern Beaches Council and Department of Social Services. Grant revenue has declined in 2019, this is attributable to a one-off surf club facilities grant valued at \$26k that was accounted for in 2018. Grants continue to be actively pursued during the year with a number of applications submitted. \$6k was received from Northern Beaches Council in 2019 that is currently recorded as deferred revenue on the balance sheet. This will be recognised in 2020.

Without the continued support from our member's contributions, sponsors, donors and function activities we could not remain a financially viable club. Annual membership fees are invaluable both for the club and especially for members, giving them access to latest club facilities. However, further assistance and support is required to ensure we can continue to provide benefits to our members and the community.

EXPENSES

Our primary goal as a surf lifesaving club is to keep our beach safe for all swimmers and those who visit our shores. It can be costly to maintain our equipment to such a high standard together with providing ongoing training for our members. This year we spent \$14,286 on our beach operations, medical, training, maintaining IRB's, Safety equipment, Board and Skis. With much of this equipment used to save lives the aim is to avoid the risk of equipment failure during a rescue.

With our patrolling members visible on our beach during weekends and public holidays many are also competing in Surf Lifesaving competitions at Branch, State and National levels. This year we spent \$8,494

on competition costs. This is one area where the club can see tangible results and is an avenue we can encourage and develop a competitive spirit among our members. We should not overlook the efforts of those members who officiate at these competitions to ensure they run smoothly and fairly for all competitors.

Another area of expenditure we see as beneficial has been the continued updates to the clubhouse. This year we spent \$1,844 on clubhouse improvements and maintenance. Expenditure in this area is down on previous years. Further investments are required to the clubhouse in future years. The maintenance of our Clubhouse is always ongoing as it's exposed to the harsh elements of our environment. This work involves many of our club members volunteering their time and resources to get the job completed to such a professional standard. We are very appreciative of their commitment to make it all happen.

Clothing and merchandise is another key area of expenditure for the club. Whilst some of this expenditure generates revenues for the club through clothing sales not all purchases do. The club will often subsidise clothing for members that represent the club in competition. Clothing expenditure is greater than the revenue generated in 2019 due to the fact a large amount of clothing stock was purchased. A percentage of stock is subsidised by the club for members and volunteers. Clothing sales also generate little profit. This is done to keep costs for members purchasing these items down. By having members wearing club merchandise it assists in building awareness of the club within the local community.

NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR

With the clubs revenues growing over recent financial years and strong profits being recorded the club is in a strong position moving forward. This ensures we can invest in the best surf lifesaving training and equipment available to our members, their families and our community. We strive to ensure we have adequate facilities and can provide the many competition and social activities for our members and the community to enjoy.

During the 2020 Financial Year the club plans to invest in key items such as a new surf boat which was recently ordered and continued improvements to the clubhouse and purchasing of new surf life saving equipment.

I would like to thank my fellow committee members who made these financial results possible. Without their dedication to growing and maintaining revenues and managing our expenses so diligently we would not have achieved these positive financial results.

BILGOLA PRESENTATION NIGHT





BLACKMORES BILLY SWIM





We had the opportunity to move the swim back from December to the second weekend in January as Avalon decided to move their swim to March.

Coupled with this move we had a new logo designed – thanks to Karen Kirby at Ignite and a range of t-shirts and swim bags to complete the shift. The publicity team of David Elliot, Rowan Jacobs, Guy Treloar, Dudley Hoskins and Jonathan Papworth made the switch pretty seamless with the team bombing local centres, Triathlon and Swim Clubs and anyone who pulled on a pair of swimmers had a flyer or poster thrust on them. Additional chops go to Dudley who provided the Training Diary found in the Bilgola News and the website.



The moving of the swim put us in the midst of the Pittwater Swim Series which has been supported by the NSW State Government and Northern Beaches Council. The shift to January was a success for Bilgola with an immediate jump in entries to over 500 swimmers for the two swims, but it caught us short with the majority of entrants turning up on the day. Turning up also was a roaring Southerly wind that made the conditions really difficult for both the swimmers and water safety personnel.

As per usual – and something that Bilgola is now well known for – the deployment of the water safety was impeccable, along with the setting of the course and the contribution by the IRBs and Branch RWCs in the trying conditions. Additionally, the rowers worked long and hard on the shoreline setup and dismantling of all the facilities that go with a swim. The Junior Committee stepped up to do all of the catering, much appreciated by all of the volunteers and the swimmers. However the person who I must acknowledge was our Entry Registration and Timekeeper, Adrian, taking on the hardest job on the day, gathering entries from impatient (and late) swimmers, noting times of the first to the last swimmer and compiling the lists of prizewinners for our awards. He was generous in the face of a lot of pressure.

The 500m swim was went off well, with the Bilgola rowers leading the group. Choppy conditions confronted the swimmers on going out, but assisted them on return.

The 1500m swim itself was tough, pushing into the wind for the first couple of legs but this allowed swimmers to have the wind at their backs for the final two legs. Making this distance was an achievement in itself so to have all but about 20 people that were taken out of the water or turned back shows the resilience of ocean swimmers. Despite the energy sapping swim, spirits were high when everyone came back to get the victory sausages or the fruit supplied by Harris Farm.

I'd like to thank Blackmores as the major sponsor of the Billy Swim – they support us in many ways before the swim then show up and support us a lot more on the day with prizes, personnel, start and finish lines and so much more. Harris Farm supplied the fruit and lots of it for the day. NSW State Government and Northern Beaches Council both contributed to the success of the day as part of the Pittwater Swim Series. Adrenalin and DMC Fins very kindly contributed prizes on the day. But most of all I would like to thank the Bilgola Surf Club community. Every year in every way people step in and step up to make this event a highlight not just for the swimmers but also for the members of the club. CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

This season was very dry and hot with very few wet days resulting in high beach attendances on just about every weekend and the Christmas, New Year, Australia Day, Anzac Day and Easter public holidays. With such a demand for our members lifesaving skills and services I am happy to report once again that no lives were lost in the water this season and significant rescue events were very low.

Overview

One hundred and forty (140) patrols were undertaken this season with a massive 7,575 hours of patrolling from 197 proficient members.

As like seasons past special thanks must go to the Madew, Rogers, Hall, Hawkins and Dahdah families as well as Greg Franks, Emanuel Freer, David Gillard and Ian MacDonald for going the extra mile to volunteer extra hours when needed to ensure we have full coverage on our beaches each weekend.

Our cadets managed by Rob Farr have again provided valuable services when water safety is needed for Nippers and the Billy Swim.

Our patrolling numbers have increased this season with a large group of under 14 Nippers achieving



their Surf Rescue Certificate and two training groups of Bronze Medallion being run adding 49 patrollers. Thanks Rowan Jacob for your training efforts

Patrol Captain of the Year

Greg Franks has this year again volunteered a huge number of hours beyond his rostered patrols.

Sydney Northern Beaches Rescue of the Month

Lifesaving doesn't always happen on the beach. Our skills and knowledge can be applied everywhere in our daily lives – even when we are driving on our way to patrol!



Cameron Scully was awarded Rescue of the Month in October 2018 for his actions in the saving of a cyclist's life whilst driving from university in Wollongong to Bilgola for a rostered patrol.

Here is the citation: -

Branch Rescue of the month

Nineteen year old Cameron Scully (Patrol 10) has been acknowledged for his involvement at an incident on McCarrs Creek Road on October 1 by being awarded the Surf Life Saving Sydney Northern Beaches (SLSSNB) Rescue of the month. This is a huge honour and recognition of his actions.

In short he was driving to patrol from Wollongong where he attends university. Cam was minutes from the beach when he came across a cyclist who had collapsed on remote McCarrs Creek Road.

Cameron stopped to help the man who was semiconscious and struggling to breathe. Then he stopped breathing. A passing doctor had also stopped to assist and together they commenced cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Within minutes a passing fire brigade truck with an AED also stopped to assist. The patient was transported to hospital for ongoing treatment. Cam acknowledges the other first responders involved saying it was a team effort as they all had lifesaving skills.

In Conclusion

I will be moving on from the Club Captain at the end of this season and I would like to thank every patrolling member over the past few years of my role in this position for their dedication and loyalty to the club ensuring we have a safe, inclusive and family orientated community of which all members can be proud.

Special thanks always to our volunteers on Christmas Day, Billy Boat Carnival and our Billy Swim. Giving time on these occasions is sometimes difficult and as such is especially appreciated.

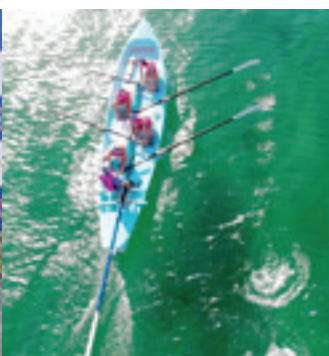

The assessment day saw a large sweeping NE swell pushing right across Newport beach, the chosen venue. The move to Mona Vale basin was well received by all involved, where the assessment went smoothly in the shore dump for all but one candidate who completed her SRC in January with several candidates who could not attend in December.



Since gaining their qualifications, we have had 18 extra patrol members on hand, helping to launch the IRB, attending to first aid patients and doing roving patrols up and down our glorious beach. They have also been turning up to Nippers to act as water safety on Sunday mornings and to help out as assistant age managers, to the delight of the age managers with large numbers in their groups. In April, on a sparkling Sunday morning, many of the squad and some of their parents (who have been magnificent in their support over many seasons of Sunday mornings!) enjoyed a kayaking expedition from Bayview up to Elvina Bay and back as a bonding exercise that will hopefully see them all back at the start of the 2020 season to join the training squad for their Bronze Award. It is so gratifying to play a part in the development of what will be the future leaders of our Bilgola Surf Lifesaving Club. Rest assured we will be in safe hands in the decades to come!

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2019

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, Charitable Fundraising Act (NSW), Associations Incorporation Act and Australian Accounting Standards Board and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Membership fees

Membership fees received in advance of the current year will be brought to account as income in the appropriate year.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Taxes

Under the tax system, the Club was endorsed on 1 July 2000 by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) as an income tax exempt entity.

Fringe Benefits Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, was exempt from Fringe Benefits Tax under *Section 57A* of the *Fringe Benefits Assessment Act 1986*. No fringe benefits were paid as the Club did not employ staff during the reportable period.

Capital Gains Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, is exempt from Capital Gains Tax under *Section 50-5* of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

No provision is required for income tax as the Club's income is exempt.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2019

Property

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation.

Property Leasehold Improvements, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the club during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of the recognition of the liability.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and cessation of all involvement in those goods.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue from fund raisings, donations, grants/subsidies, sponsorships is recognised at fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account the period of commitment. Income is recognized on accruals basis which is at the point income is committed, not received.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

Contingent Liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities that the committee members are aware of that will have material effects to the financial report.

Events Subsequent To Reporting Date

Since the end of the financial year, there are no material events that have come to the attention of the committee members that will have material impact on the financial report.

Financial Risk Management

The club's financial instruments consists mainly of deposits with banks, short-term investments, accounts receivable and payable.

Financial Risk Management Policies

The association treasurer's overall risk management strategy seeks to assist the club in meeting its financial targets, whilst minimising potential adverse effects on financial performance.

Risk management policies are approved and reviewed by the members committee on a regular basis. These included the credit risk policies and future cash flow requirements.

The main purpose of non-derivative financial instruments is to raise finance for company operations. The club does not have any derivative instruments.
