#### **BRONZE MEDALLION FEES**

Training fee for new bronze members over 18 years is \$200. For all new members under 18 years, the fee is \$150. This covers 1-year membership, training manual, patrol uniform and cap. This fee is paid prior to training commencing. All under 18 years renewing members pay a registration fee of \$75 for all training which includes 1-year membership (these people will already have their own uniform and training manual from SRC).

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Sundays at Bilgola really does represent what our beach is all about - IRB and Bronze training starts at 7am, Surfboats are usually out by 8am, Patrol starts setting up at 8.30am and Nippers starts at 9am. If you want to know what a Surf Club is like - just rock up to Bilgola on a Sunday morning. It may sound chaotic but it works. The colour from all the different high-vis rashies, the noise and activity is thrilling to watch and especially to be involved.

This is my fifth year as President and I find every season different, from the rescues, surf conditions, competition, celebrations and farewells. We celebrated the wonderful service of Bruce Robertson, Australia's oldest lifesaver and saw the retiring Tony White after 40 years of surf lifesaving. We also sadly farewelled Tony "Rollo" Bland, Richard "Mr Bean" Crayfourd and Peter O'Gready. We had a good season when it came to lifesaving, with over 7,000 lifesaving volunteer hours with no major incidents, great beach conditions and a very active club. When I meet beach goers who say "Bilgola is our favourite beach" I hope that is in part due to our many volunteers whose service ensures the community can enjoy a fun and safe day at the beach.

The Senior Committee have been focusing on maintaining membership and financial sustainability. We have been successful with both. Membership in both junior activities and social membership has been growing and patrolling membership has held. In addition, due to good financial management, even with a reduction in sponsorship revenue, our profit for the year is due to be higher than 2016/17.

With regard to what we are here for - lifesaving, I cannot speak highly enough about our Patrols and Patrol Captains, captured by two emails we received during the season. The first from Glen Tolan, Sydney Northern Beaches SLS, Director of Lifesaving "I was Duty Officer on Sunday and visited Bilgola in the morning, just after nippers finished. I met Richard (Hardwick) the Patrol Captain (Patrol 13) and was very impressed by the standard of the beach set up (equipment) and branding of the patrol - everyone in full uniform, so I wanted to write to you and let you know. It is always a proud and rewarding moment to see a patrol like that". This was followed by an email from Doug Menzies, Branch President, Sydney Northern Beaches SLS "I just wanted to drop you a short note of congratulations for your Afternoon Patrol (Steve Faddy, Patrol 10). I went to Bilgola Pool to do a little hydro therapy for my knees. It was so pleasing to see 2 of your patrolling members undertake a Roving Patrol south of the Patrol area making their way to the pool, spending some time there observing and interacting with the public. It was also so refreshingly pleasing to also note that they were in 'full uniform'. My congratulations and a well done to your members who displayed such a professional image of our volunteer surf life savers. Yours in surf lifesaving, Doug Menzies."

Bilgola has 12 Patrols who cover 142 patrols, each patrol averaging 12-13 patrols a season or around 50-60 hours volunteering. This is in addition to some competing, volunteering for water safety, undergoing training, and proficiency and in many cases some are also Committee members and Nipper Age Managers. Their commitment and dedication is inspiring.

One of the interesting things about Bilgola is that many of our Patrols are made up of 3-4 families, in a number of cases their kids have come through Nippers and SRC, joined a Patrol and their parents then undertook their Bronze.

Over the past few seasons we have been focusing on increasing the number of women who have their Silver Beach Management certificate. This is required if you want to be a Patrol Captain, Vice Patrol Captain or Acting Patrol Captain. I am pleased to say the number of women who act in these roles is increasing with now 11 with this certificate, a third of our members with this award.

Our training has once again been overseen by Pete Fenley with support by Trainers this year Isabelle Schmidt, Craig Poppleton, Kaz Marks, Rowan Jacobs (SRCs), Rob Farr and Richard Hardwick and in the IRBs; Nigel Penn, Bill Hawkins, David Madew and Marc Bernard.

Our Cadet program continue to get stronger and develop. Watching our Cadets grow from Nippers undertake with their SRC and Bronze and the hours they contribute to patrolling and water safety is inspiring. They amaze me with their maturity, especially when being involved in difficult rescues. Rob Chant (Cadet Manager), Isabelle Schmidt, Josh Axford, Rob Farr and Rowan Jacobs have all spent many hours supporting our many Cadets. They should be proud of the level of involvement and participation we saw. We had a number of our younger life savers also selected to represent Bilgola at Surf Life Saving academies including Elliott Prasad (JLOTY male winner for 2017) and Lucille Moore attend the Youth Opportunity Makers (YOM) program run by Surf Life Saving NSW.

Our Nippers program this year was fantastic, the Junior Committee can be proud of the engagement by both the kids and parents. Watching this younger generation learning about surf safety, surf conditions, lifesaving and



competition is not only fun but a privilege. Their enthusiasm is contagious.

Our IRB area continues to grow thanks to Piet Poelmann (IRB Captain), Bill Hawkins and David Madew. We have 25 drivers and over 35 crew. Training happens all year especially now we have a number of crews competing in IRB racing. It is also wonderful to see the increasing number of females involved from teenagers to mums.

Thanks to Marcus and Caroline Blackmore, Blackmore Foundation, we launched the Westpac Little Ripper Lifesaver drone at the Blackmores Billy Ocean Swim in December and the "Bruce Robertson" IRB Thundercat Gen3 at his farewell celebration in April. Over many weekends the Little Ripper could be seen flying over the beach as pilots trained at the southern end of the beach. This illustrates how lifesaving is moving with technology, supporting our lifesaving efforts.

The Blackmores Billy Ocean Swim was held in December with clear skies and a great support from our local politicians including Jason Falinski Federal MP, Rob Stokes State MLA (who swam the 1,500m), Mayor Michael Regan, Northern Beaches Council and Kylie Ferguson, Northern Beaches Councillor where we set the competitors off for their 800m and/or 1500m ocean swim. Our winners came from the ranks of experienced and well trained ocean swimmers who featured strongly in last year's event, together with some new faces in the younger ranks. Our swimmers ranged in age from 13 right up to 77 years old. Our numbers were close to our entrants last year at almost 300 swimmers across both events. Thanks to Ray Trevisan, our Swim Coordinator, who pulled this wonderful event together, spending many hours to ensure its success.

The Annual Boat Carnival, was held in November. this is the greater Sydney region's first surfboat competition event of the season. The Billy carnival is a popular event on the competition calendar, recognised as one of best run events for both officials and competitors. It offers a relaxed and fun introduction to crews keen to get back into the surf after the winter hiatus. Over 60 crews raced across all divisions.

I'd like to highlight and thank our senior committee, who work tirelessly to ensure our club runs smoothly, with a number acknowledged at the Presentation evening as they have gone above and beyond with their commitment to the Club. Four of our Committee members were also in the top ten patrollers list including David Madew, Pete Fenley, Nigel Penn and myself. We say farewell to the following committee members; Claire Cupitt (Secretary), Rob Chant (Cadet Manager) and Mark Fitzgerald (Boat Captain). We also had a number of members support the committee including James Campbell (Training), Alex Kennedy (Communications), Ben Gill (House) and Rowan Jacobs (Sponsorship).

Sadly Robert Storey who has been our Honorary Solicitor for a number of years has retired, we thank him for his support and service.

We couldn't run the club and all the programs and initiatives without the support of our many sponsors, starting with our Major Sponsor - Blackmores. Marcus and Caroline Blackmore continue to be active members of the club as do many of the Blackmores team. Other sponsors include Northern Beaches Council, United Resource Management (URM), Amber Waves, Avalon Meats and Neil Jones from BlueStone Homes (Open Men's Crew - Ocean Thunder). For the Blackmores Billy Ocean Swim we were again wonderfully supported by additional sponsors including Harris Farm Markets, Emma & Tom's Juices, RMYC Newport, Bilgola Primary School, Back to Health Physio, Talk Audio Visual and Adrenalin Sports.

#### **Bruce Robertson**

A LIFETIME of public service rests well on the broad shoulders of Australia's oldest active patrolling lifesaver, 87-year-old Bruce Robertson.

The summer patrols have started and Bruce is again on the beach with his patrol members. He no longer has his driver's licence, so he catches the bus from his inner-city home to Bilgola, faithfully turning up once a month ready to do his duty alongside his younger lifesaver mates.

Bruce started his extraordinary volunteer lifesaving journey when he was just 12.

His father was away at war and Bruce had a Saturday morning job at Swain's in Sydney city, the same place as actor Rod Taylor.

"He and I became good mates. He was very keen to join the surf lifesaving movement so we both went down to Mona Vale," Bruce said.

So, in 1942 Bruce and Rod joined Mona Vale club where they both gained their Bronze.

"There was only one person over 18 at the club then, and that was the president, George Wray," Bruce said. "They didn't ask our age because there was nobody else." The war had taken all the older members away.

Bruce and Rod remained firm friends until Rod drifted off into the pursuit of his art at East Sydney Tech College and films, while Bruce remained in school.

"Rod was almost two years older than me," Bruce said. "He was also very successful with the ladies," Bruce added with a chuckle

Bruce started as a rower for the club's surf boat crew. Mona Vale had won the national championship in 1939 and they were looking to return to that glory.

So, at 12, Bruce was co-opted as a member an enormous surf

He remembers rowing in the 1954 surf carnival at Bondi Beach which the Queen attended. "It was an enormous surf, but it was a fantastic day," Bruce recounts.

He also has found memories of his rowing mates, some 15 or 16 of them, sleeping on gym mats in the clubhouse. "We would go down to the club for the weekend," he said.

It wasn't until 1950 that Bruce moved to Bilgola to join some of his friends.

After school finished Bruce attended Duntroon where he graduated as a Lieutenant. He spent two years in the army before the ambitious young man left to join the corporate world in building materials.

Throughout this time and in the ensuing years his volunteer lifesaving commitment never waived.

While he may have retired from paid work at 60, that was the only retiring he did. He next took on chairman of Taronga Zoo, then the deputy chair of the Botanic Gardens and then onto Keep Australia Beautiful while continuing to play golden oldies rugby union for the Gordon club where he was vice-president and keeping up his active lifesaving volunteering role at Bilgola Beach.

"I'm not keen to get into anything competitive these days," Bruce admits. "I will still walk the beach," Bruce said. His patrol group are on duty once a month for four hours. If there is a crisis, Bruce said he now lets his younger patrol members deal with it.

"I find there is a lot of respect by younger people today," Bruce said of his fellow patrol members.

"I think the younger generation are to be admired. They have not had the thumb put on them.

"In my generation, the thumb was down on you. Today, people are out to make the best of everything and that applies to young people. I admire them enormously.

"Now I am quite happy to sit and watch, to see what people do.

"So much has happened and so many changes have been made, really I should be one trying to get as much as I can from them."

As he gazes fondly over what has been his second home for all of his adult life, his greatest joy is watching how his home club has progressed. "I can remember digging into the stone to build it," Bruce said of Bilgola Surf Life Saving Club.

"I am not going to give it up. I love the club," Bruce said.

"I feel that I have to give something back to society as society has been very good to me. Surf Lifesaving is one of those ways I can give something back.

"I am enjoying living in this society. I don't want to stop," the proud lifesaver said.

The Accidental Lifesaver

Looking back on my 40 plus years of Lifesaving on Bilgola Beach a couple of books could be written in – one for public consumption and a second for restricted release. Following are some memories, observations, etc about my time at Billy.

In the summer of 1971/72 a group of players from Eastwood Rugby Club decided to join Bilgola SLSC (I was not one of them) as it was desperately short of members. However, a member of one of the squads pulled out and I was cajoled into taking his place, and 2 weeks later I was a lifesaver. Things were different in "the good old days".

The surf on the day of the Bronze testing was truly horrible and it's surprising that so many of us passed. I think the Assessor was pretty benevolent on some of the belt swims. Let's be thankful that the belt is no longer a rescue tool.

How did I come to hang around for so long? I guess the main reasons are great friendships (Steve Rouse and I have been best friends since Beecroft Primary School in the early 1950s), contributing to the community and it's been a lot of fun both on and off the beach.

#### For many years:

- Club members would turn up every Sunday to play "20" a side touch football or volley ball with a 10 pound medicine ball, where the main aim was to knock the opposing players head off.
- a surf boat was always on the beach for. On one occasion
  I remember rowing onto a wave and the Sweep calling
  to come aft. As we went aft the boat turned to the right
  across the face of the wave and rolled. I was the only
  person in the boat when it hit the beach sideways 3 oars
  were broken. We were not too popular but we (the rowers)
  knew it was the Sweeps fault.
- the Clubhouse bunkroom was mostly full on a Saturday night. It was great to emerge on a Sunday morning and wash the cobwebs away in the surf. However, the mattresses were a little "second hand" and it was not a great place if you wanted a quiet night's sleep. With the inclusion of female lifesavers in the 1980s and the need to generally upgrade the Clubs facilities, the bunkroom had to go.

In 1974 there was a massive storm that caused serious damage all along the coast. At Bilgola the waves were washing across the car park up to the Public Change Rooms stairs and destroyed a house in Allen St, and the beach side pool of another house, and yes, another Clubhouse boat ramp was destroyed. It also threw a large boulder through the boatshed doors, landing in the back of the boat room

In the winter of 1992 a "Patrol" took a belt and reel, the march past flag and numerous sets of patrol gear to Perisher where the "Patrol" entered in the Pub to Pub cross-country competition. The "Patrol" skied the several kilometres from Smiggin Holes to the Valley Inn at Perisher in march-past formation and won \$500 for the best fancy dress entrant. No lives were lost.

The local Council introduced parking restrictions at the Club, in the Reserve above the Club and in the streets around the Club has drastically reducing patronage of the beach. Before the restrictions you could park anywhere and it was utter chaos on busy days. We could have a couple of thousand people on the beach. Now a couple of hundred is exceptional. On busy days you either parked at Newport or stayed late.

Life Saving has changed substantially over the years and continues to evolve and improve. The introduction of technology and extensive training has enabled patrolling to be far more proactive and effective. For example:

- the phasing out of the belt and reel, and surf boats (other than for competition). I can remember looking back at Bilgola and Newport Beaches one day at the end of 400m of belt line and thinking there has to be a better way.
- The "Duck" is great as 2 Lifesavers can be in action within minutes whereas with a surf boat you needed 5 and a bit of luck when there was any sort of surf running. The "Ducks" were not without problems in the early when they were used with a level of raw enthusiasm. We had a number of spectacular accidents e.g. when Jamie Stokoe came in one day saying he thought he had broken his ankle. He was correct but as it was his left ankle he was able to drive himself to Mona Vale Hospital what a man. His was just one of several breaks experienced by members before training became more comprehensive.
- The use of radios where in the past somebody had to get to the Clubhouse and call for an ambulance.
- The use of the oxy-viva and defibrillator. Not so long ago they weren't available on the beach.
- The helicopter excellent at exfoliation when you are standing under one on the beach waiting for a Paramedic to be lowered.

All these things (and others) work toward making the beaches safer, but it's the lifesavers that make it all come together. I wish all at Bilgola SLSC all the best for the future and I look forward to still joining senior members of Patrol 2 for coffee at Zubi's.

PS: I still have trouble with acronyms - must be old age.

#### Richard "Mr Bean" Crayfourd

Richard Crayfourd, a Distinguished Service Member was a long standing and distinguished service member (affectionately known as Mr. Bean). Rich originally joined the club as a nipper parent in 1990 and became an age manager shortly after. He remained an age manager for some years and served on both the senior and junior committees, including the roles as branch delegate, Club Vice President and Hon Secretary. He was an active member of the renovation team which carried out the major extensions to the clubhouse from 2000 to 2002, and has been an enthusiastic support of our club for over 20 years. He later became a level 1 official and officiated at many boat carnivals and was a member of the branch TIPS team.

At his funeral service held at the club, his daughter Emma Crayfourd shared this: "A message from our sponsor. Richard always enjoyed the last word in debate, some things don't change. The first and most important thing is for recognition of my Rock, my loyal companion, lover and faithful carer, Jenny, she has never failed me through this journey. Second is our two children who both supported me and retained inspiration to keep on keeping on. Bob and Graham and Emma's partner David have also been wonderful and really appreciated, thank you all. To my surprisingly large group of friends, I can also say thanks, particularly Bilgola Burglars & work colleagues. I had a good life with few regrets. Make sure you can say the same if you want real peace when it matters, love Richard"

#### **Tony Rollo Bland**

Bilgola SLSC farewelled Tony 'Rollo' Bland in December 2017. Tony joined the club 60 years ago. He achieved his Bronze in 1958, has been Club Treasurer, President and Auditor and was made a Life Member in 1978. He was an excellent swimmer especially in long distance events. The Club had three Bilgola Surf Boats raise their oars and three IRBs on the water while his ashes were spread with his friends and family watching on. During his wake, a pod of dolphins were swimming in the bay and as one of the Life Members was reminiscing five F18s flew past.

On the day of his farewell, club member, John Stone read an "Ode to Rollo". I first met Rollo when he joined the surf club 60 years ago but I had more quality time with him over the last 6 months than the previous 60 years. We would meet at Bilgola Pool a couple of times a week, Between the two of us, we knew just about every one of the regular swimmers We were two old farts, Rollo with his surgical boot and electric bike from the boot of his car, me with Parkinsons. Rollo would often visit me at home and we would sit for hours over a beer or two discussing current affairs, old friends, family, sailing and Surf Club finances, Marcus' latest boat...Rats Rugby – he was a Norths Supporter. These were most enjoyable afternoons for me and I hope for him.

#### Peter O'Gready

Long Serving Member Peter O'Gready, aged 84 years died in March 2018 with his family by his side. Up until two years ago Peter was still patrolling at our beach. He had been a member of Bilgola SLSC for 61 years and always patrolled.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

The executive committee continues to strive to maintain and enhance the club's facilities and cannot do so without the generous support of all our members, the community and local authorities during our various fund raising events and club activities held throughout the year.

#### **PRELIMINARY**

A profit of \$40,767 for the 2018 financial year was recorded (2017: \$31,824). A major focus of the committee during the year was on maintaining and growing our revenue levels. The 2017 year we saw revenues grow 33% and the club post a strong profit. We have been able to maintain this position in 2018.

Our major sponsor Blackmores have continued their generous support providing funding for many upgrades to the clubs operational activities including the ongoing assistance to our Nippers program, surf boat sponsorship, beach safety, clubhouse maintenance and life saving equipment.

Our success in surf competitions has continued throughout the year with many of our member's posting success in the junior, senior and master's events at Branch, State and National carnivals. It is always important for the club to allocate adequate funding to compete in these events and provide our competitors with the best competitive equipment.

#### FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The financial results for the year ended 31 May 2018 recorded in the Income Statement show continued strength in income derived from memberships, functions and our major fund raising events. Our overall revenue remained consistent with 2017 levels further strengthening the clubs financial position and ability to fund core activities.

From the \$370,393, (2017: \$371,071) in revenue earned the club has spent \$329,626 (2017: \$339,247) across various club activities including upgrading and maintaining equipment and the facilities enjoyed by members. The end result for the year saw a profit of \$40,767 (2017: \$31,824). The retained earnings of the club is \$299,973 (2017: \$259,206). The clubs cash position has been strengthened during the year with cash deposits at the end of the financial year being \$228,516 (2017: \$203,058).

#### **INCOME**

Our revenue base for funding our expenditure primarily came from Membership subscriptions, Sponsorship, Donations, Grants, Fund Raising activities and functions. Revenue this year was \$370,393 which is in line with 2017 levels. Whilst there has been some fluctuations in some of our revenue streams the majority have remained relatively consistent with 2017.

Without the continued support from our member's contributions, sponsors, donors and function activities we could not remain a financially viable club. Annual membership fees are invaluable both for the club and especially for members, giving them access to latest club facilities. However, further assistance and support is required to ensure we can continue to provide benefits to our members and the community.

Our major fundraising events, the Bilgola swim along with our regular Sippers and Nippers BBQ were once again well supported by our local community, business and members. All these events are as important as each other in relieving the financial burden of funding the clubs activities. Increasing function activity has been a particular focus of the committee during the last two years. 2018 saw an increase of 12% which continues to build upon on our efforts of 2017 which saw a 52% increase in function revenue from 2016.

Donations are very special to us and provide a personal way for members and non-members to support the club. This year we again received income from the trust fund bequeathed to the club by our past long-standing member Bob De Groot. No matter how large or small the donations we receive every dollar does indeed help, so again we thank all our donors for their continued support. Donations are also tax deductible due to the club being a non-profit organisation with "Deductible Gift Recipient" status. During 2018 we conducted a mail out within the local community requesting their support of the club through donations. This was well received with a number of donations being received as a result.

During 2017 a grant of \$26,056 was received from Surf Life Saving NSW. The grant was to upgrade specific surf club facilities as identified during an audit of clubs. This grant was recorded as deferred income (liability) on the balance sheet in 2017. These funds were spent in 2018 and as a result recorded as grant income in the 2018 accounts. This is the reason why grants income has increased on 2017 levels. The funds were primarily used to upgrade the clubs lighting facilities to assist in reducing future operating costs of the club.

During the year two of the clubs older surfboats were sold. These sales generated \$15,182 in cash receipts. These sales did not translate directly to revenue within the income statement as one of the boats was still being carried on the balance sheet as an asset. The sale of this boat covered the remaining value being carried on balance the sheet.

#### **EXPENSES**

Our primary goal as a surf lifesaving club is to keep our beach safe for all swimmers and those who visit our shores. It can be costly to maintain our equipment to such a high standard together with providing ongoing training for our members. This year we spent \$19,475 on our beach operations, medical, training, maintaining IRB's, Safety equipment, Board and Skis. With much of this equipment used to save lives the aim is to avoid the risk of equipment failure during a rescue. In addition, the club invested in a new IRB engine.

With our patrolling members visible on our beach during weekends and public holidays many are also competing in Surf Lifesaving competitions at Branch, State and National levels. This year we spent \$12,846 on competition costs. This is one area where the club can see tangible results and is an avenue we can encourage and develop a competitive spirit among our members. We should not overlook the efforts of those members who officiate at these competitions to ensure they run smoothly and fairly for all competitors. All of their time and resources are volunteered to make our club even more competitive each year.

Another area of expenditure we see as beneficial has been the continued updates to the clubhouse. This year we spent \$54,691 on clubhouse improvements and maintenance. This includes key items like the lighting upgrades and new outside awnings for the clubhouse. The maintenance of our Clubhouse is always ongoing as it's exposed to the harsh elements of our environment. This work involves many of our club members volunteering their time and resources to get the job completed to such a professional standard. We are very appreciative of their commitment to make it all happen.

#### **NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR**

With the clubs revenues being consistent over the last two financial years and strong profits being recorded we have put the club in a strong position to ensure we can invest in the best surf lifesaving training and equipment available to our members, their families and our community. We strive to ensure we have adequate facilities and can provide the many competition and social activities for our members and the community to enjoy.

I would like to thank my fellow committee members who made these financial results possible. Without their dedication to growing and maintaining revenues and managing our expenses so diligently we would not have achieved these positive financial results.

Kaz, a member of both Bilgola SLSC and Narrabeen Beach SLSC, was first on stage at Dee Why RSL last Friday night as part of that very valuable TIPS team, who received the Services Award. Kaz has been officiating for quite sometime in First Aid, Championship Lifesaver, surfboats but is focusing now on IRB's.

Maintenance of training standards are a necessary part of being a lifesaving volunteer and as a check of these standards Sydney Northern Beaches Surf Lifesaving conduct patrol audits. Patrol audits were again undertaken this season and Bilgola performed well in all reports. Thank you to all patrollers who were part of the patrols who were participants in these demanding assessments.

Skills Maintenance (Proficiency testing / annual reendorsement) was, as always, undertaken at the start of the season and it was great to see so many patrollers get this done early making it much easier for the club trainers to complete this Service Agreement requirement efficiently.

Our Cadets have once again shone with their continual support of Nippers, the Billy Big Swim and patrols. Thanks to Rob Chant and Josh Axford for their work with our youth membership and assisting in maintaining cadet engagement. 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

#### 1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, Charitable Fundraising Act (NSW), Associations Incorporation Act and Australian Accounting Standards Board and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### Membership fees

Membership fees received in advance of the current year will be brought to account as income in the appropriate year.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

#### **Taxes**

Under the tax system, the Club was endorsed on 1 July 2000 by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) as an income tax exempt entity.

#### Fringe Benefits Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, was exempt from Fringe Benefits Tax under *Section 57A* of the *Fringe Benefits Assessment Act 1986*. No fringe benefits were paid as the Club did not employ staff during the reportable period.

#### **Capital Gains Tax**

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, is exempt from Capital Gains Tax under Section 50-5 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

No provision is required for income tax as the Club's income is exempt.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2018

#### **Property**

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation.

#### Property Leasehold Improvements, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

#### **Trade and Other Payables**

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the club during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of the recognition of the liability.

#### **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

#### **Comparative Figures**

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2018

#### **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and cessation of all involvement in those goods.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue from fund raisings, donations, grants/subsidies, sponsorships is recognised at fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account the period of commitment. Income is recognized on accruals basis which is at the point income is committed, not received.

#### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

#### **Contingent Liabilities**

There are no contingent liabilities that the committee members are aware of that will have material effects to the financial report.

#### **Events Subsequent To Reporting Date**

Since the end of the financial year, there are no material events that have come to the attention of the committee members that will have material impact on the financial report.

#### **Financial Risk Management**

The club's financial instruments consists mainly of deposits with banks, short-term investments, accounts receivable and payable.

#### **Financial Risk Management Policies**

The association treasurer's overall risk management strategy seeks to assist the club in meeting its financial targets, whilst minimising potential adverse effects on financial performance.

Risk management policies are approved and reviewed by the members committee on a regular basis. These included the credit risk policies and future cash flow requirements.

The main purpose of non-derivative financial instruments is to raise finance for company operations. The club does not have any derivative instruments.

With high expectations, for a 2017-18 season the Benny's were on the mark early in the season, making the final and finishing fourth at the competitive state team selection event at Mollymook. Unfortunately, the Benny's season was interrupted and cut short by injury. After surgery to reattach his ruptured bicep pre-season, stroke Mitch Renouf charged into season confidently, bravely and competently only to succumb to injury midway through. The boys were saved by a raggedy haired angel in the form of veteran Bilgola rower Mark Hooley, who, after dusting off some cobwebs was competition ready in just a few weeks.

With Hools, whom the Benny's now call 'the human metronome', bringing his years of experience to the crew, and the Benny's teaching Benny the valuable lesson of chilling-out in high pressure situations (and at other times), the As managed to place top 8 in both the ASRL and State championships – finishing the season with a high. Some impressive results for the Open Men considering the adversity they had to overcome.

Although Mark Hooley capably stepped in and lifted the crew's enthusiasm and competitiveness, they were unable to cross the country to compete at the Aussies this year, with their last event being the NSW State Championships.

The Benny's would like to recognise and express their gratitude to Neil Jones of Bluestone Homes for his sponsorship of the crew into the Ocean Thunder series. This financial support by ex-Billy rower Jonesy, provided club sponsor Blackmores with considerable television exposure with our prominently branded surfboat throughout the televised OT event. OT is a commercial event and not part of the SLS competitive circuit. The Benny's were publicly congratulated by the event organiser for their admirable start to the series. The crew represented the club and Bluestone well across the four event professional series finishing in the middle of the field against the best twenty-four crews in the country.

#### U23 Women 'Bilgola Rippers'

With three of the girls having rowed previously in under nineteens, this was the crews first year in u23s. Starting the year with a novice rower, and not just a newbie to rowing but putting her in the stroke seat, Lucy quickly caught up to the other girls' skills thanks to the patience and encouragement of their sweep, coach and surf mentor, Benny Gill. As first-time entrants into the division, as the youngest crew in the division and with a novice rower, who could have guessed the accomplishments these girls would achieve across the

Only weeks after the crew rowed together for the first time, they came away with a win in the North Cronulla carnival

in December. Following which, the Rippers placed 5th in the final at the biggest surfboat event outside of the state championships, the prestigious Manly carnival, and followed that by winning the Freshwater carnival over the Australia Day weekend.

Gilly had the girls firing and peaking at the right time of the season making the semi-final at State and the final at ASRL - the Australian Surf Rowers League national championships. The across in Perth at Aussies - the SLS Australian Championships, despite winning the round robin point score, the girls were knocked out in the semi-final, placing 7th overall on the national ranking. A big effort for first year competitors in u23s and first time ever rower Lucy. All the girls are only nineteen and have another three years to compete in this division, so watch this space.

Throughout the season Gilly had the Rippers training at the beach on Sunday mornings, then quite often showing the Nippers the ins and outs of the surfboat, with the Rippers encouraging the young girls in Cadets and Nippers to believe in themselves and their ability to compete in and conquer the wild surf.

#### Masters Men 200 'Bilgola OLDER'

## **CADETS**REPORT

This Season has been filled with some fantastic events and engaging initiatives for the Cadets.

It has been recognised that the Cadet age group (14 to 18) falls into a space that is in between the junior club and the senior club. With that in mind Rob Chant has introduced a programme directly aimed at engaging this age bracket to increase retention rates of Youth members once they have finished nippers by guidance to complete SRC and Bronze Medallion.

The Cadet Award Programme (CAP) is a points-based system to reward and give real incentive to Cadets to participate in club events and club service. Points are awarded for Participation with Club tasks / attendance / involvement with Club Events and other activities that benefit the club and its members. A cadet is classified as a registered member of age 14 to 18. It is Scaled system to reflect importance of event and effort required.
