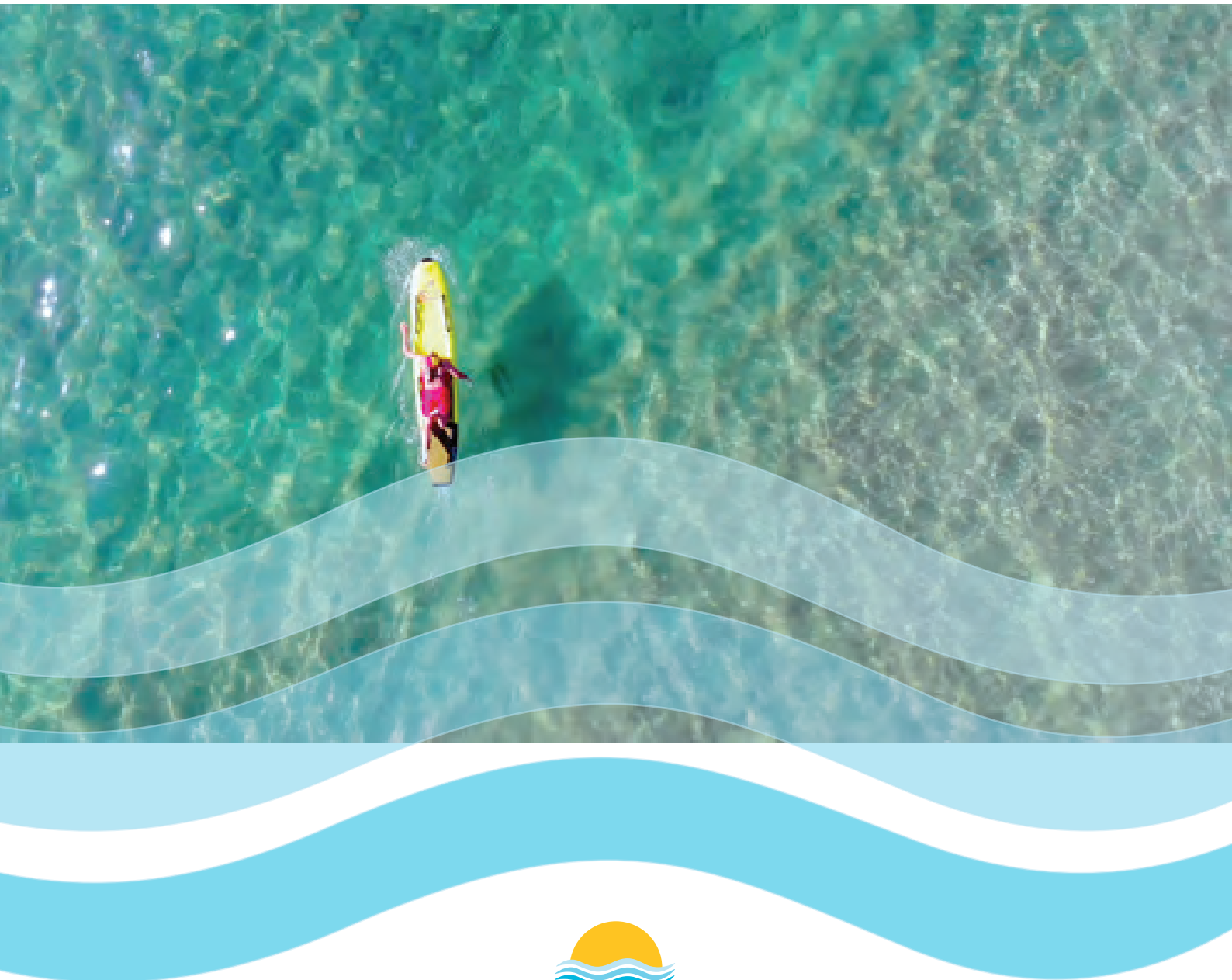

BRONZE MEDALLION FEES

All under 18 years renewing members pay a registration fee of \$75 for all training which includes a 1-year membership (these people will already have their own uniform and training manual from SRC).

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



This season was relatively quiet at Bilgola when compared to the previous 2018-19 season with no major incidents or loss of life during patrol hours although the beach was very well frequented on weekends as the weather this season was exceptionally fine and very hot.

Of course the club was impacted by COVID-19 during the second half of the season with all patrols coming to an abrupt halt but not before many of our annual events were successfully held.

Our season opened with the Club celebrating seventy years of service to the Bilgola community through continuous patrolling on rostered weekends. It was fabulous to hear renditions of old stories by colourful past members including those as to how the building of the clubhouse was financed through selling hot water to campers and day trippers before the Second World War. Thanks to Rob Goodyear and David Madew for researching, recording and compiling the video presentation that was enjoyed by everyone who attended the celebratory function.

Training was undertaken in two tranches with a small group of five candidates attaining their Bronze Medallion at the beginning of the season and a much larger group of 30 due for assessment two weeks after the COVID lockdown. In addition to the Bronze group we had another twenty eight Surf Rescue Certificate candidates only one week out from assessment when the lockdown shutters fell. All these candidates are looking forward to their assessment as soon as Branch are permitted to schedule Central Venue Assessments again.

Nippers is such an integral part of Bilgola's family orientated culture and our beach comes alive every weekend when Nippers is scheduled. A huge thank you has to go to Karen Perry for the enormous effort

Karen and her committee along with Age Managers, BBQ volunteers and water safety helpers have made throughout the season ensuring that our Nippers gained important and essential water skills whilst, most importantly, having a whole lot of fun!

Our Blackmores' "Billy" ocean swim was held for the second time in January. This date we have found suits swimmers a lot more than the pre-Christmas swim since the water is warmer and surf conditions more favourable. Thanks must again go to David Madew and Nicky Curtin as event co-ordinators along with all our volunteer patrolling members putting in a huge effort in setup, pull down, water safety, catering and event management. Thanks to Steve Faddy acting as our ever present SEMC and George Shales, SLSNSW President, for acting as our event starter.

Our Boaties have once again performed well throughout the season which commenced with the Bilgola Boat Carnival Day and we look to their future success in the forthcoming year. Thanks to Nigel Penn acting as SEMC.

Greatly appreciated is the support and contributions from Blackmores', Ray White Palm Beach, Channel 10, Harris Farm and Adrenalin whose assistance contributes to the ongoing financial viability of Bilgola SLSC.

No surf club would exist or be successful if it weren't for the efforts and contributions of active members, junior and senior committees. I would like to acknowledge those members for their support and significant dedication to the success of Bilgola SLSC. Thanks also to our Support Staff who put in a huge effort every year ensuring the smooth day to day operation of our facilities.

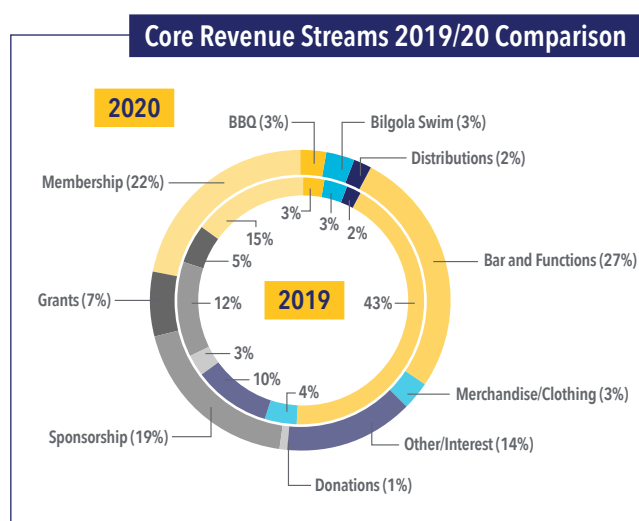
TREASURER'S REPORT

After a very tough year, the executive committee continues to strive to maintain and enhance the club's facilities and equipment and cannot do so without the generous support of all our members, the community and local authorities during our various fund-raising events and club activities held throughout the year.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Revenues generated in 2020 were \$350,493 which is 89% the revenue achieved in 2019 (\$391,983). This is a decent outcome given that bar and functions made up 43% of the revenue in 2019 and all functions ceased in mid-March, approximately 80% of the way through the financial year. From the \$350,493 in revenue earned the club has spent \$353,751 (2019: \$334,797) across various club activities including purchasing and maintaining equipment and the facilities enjoyed by members. The end of year result was a loss of \$3,258 (2019: \$57,186, 2018: \$40,768). The retained earnings of the club was \$353,901 (2019: \$357,159, 2018: \$299,973). The club's cash position has been challenged by the last half of the year with cash deposits at the end of the financial year being \$249,212 (2019: \$297,875, 2018: \$226,916).

The revenues highlighted in the following graph and the financial results for the year ended 31 May 2020 recorded in the Income Statement show continued strength in income derived from memberships, functions and our major fund-raising events. The graph below shows the FY2020 revenue stream (outside circular chart) in comparison to the FY2019 revenue stream (inside circular chart). This clearly shows that sponsorship and membership fees increased whereas bar & functions and donations reduced significantly.



The COVID crisis stopped bar and functions from being held in the last 2.5 months of financial year, although this revenue was less than the previous year before the restrictions took place. Note that membership fees included fees that members paid to take part in training and is not just revenue from membership.

INCOME

Our revenue base for funding our expenditure primarily came from Bar and functions, membership subscriptions, sponsorship, donations, grants and fund-raising activities such as the Bilgola swim. Revenue this year was \$350,493 which is 11% below 2019. As the graph above shows, there has been some fluctuations in some of our revenue streams but there has been some consistency with merchandise, the Bilgola swim, BBQ and distributions. Our major sponsor Blackmores have continued their generous support providing funding for many upgrades to the club's operational activities including the ongoing assistance to our Nippers program, surf boat sponsorship, beach safety, clubhouse maintenance and life-saving equipment. Other sponsorship from Network 10, Ray White and The Honest Chicken have also provided sponsorship income to be used for specific equipment that has been required by the club.

Our major fundraising events, the Bilgola swim along with our regular Sunday sessions, sippers and nippers BBQ were once again well supported by our local community, businesses and members up until the closure in March. All these events are as important as each other in relieving the financial burden of funding the club's activities. The focus on events like the Sunday sessions not only contributes valuable revenue to the club it also assists in fostering a sense of community within the club and provides opportunities to grow our membership base.

Donations are very special to us and provide a personal way for members and non-members to support the club. This year we again received income from the trust fund bequeathed to the club by our past long-standing member Bob De Groot. No matter how large or small the donations we receive every dollar does indeed help,

so again we thank all our donors for their continued support. Donations are also tax deductible due to the club being a non-profit organisation with "Deductible Gift Recipient" status.

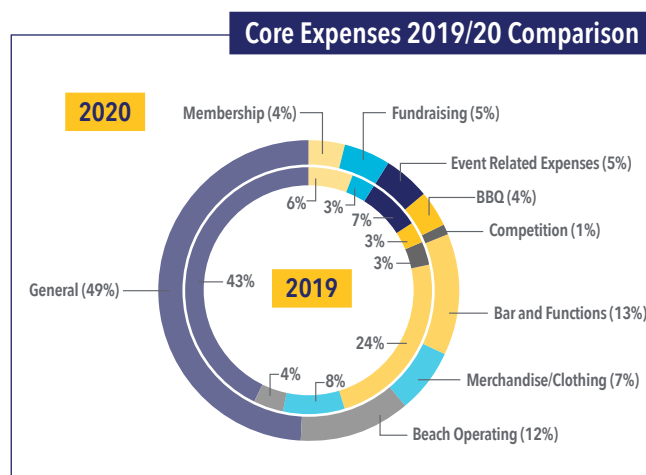
During 2019 a number of grants were received. These grants were received from organisations such as Surf Life Saving Australia (\$5,000), Northern Beaches Council (\$8,439) and Department of Infrastructure (\$10,000). Grant revenue has increased in 2020 and are actively pursued during the year with a number of applications submitted.

Without the continued support from our member's contributions, sponsors, donors and function activities we could not remain a financially viable club. Annual membership fees are invaluable both for the club and especially for members, giving them access to latest club facilities and equipment. However, further assistance and support is required to ensure we can continue to provide benefits to our members and the community.

EXPENSES

Our primary goal as a surf lifesaving club is to keep our beach safe for all swimmers and those who visit our shores. It can be costly to maintain our equipment to such a high standard together with providing ongoing training for our members. This year we spent \$43,361 on our beach operations which included \$21,000 of boards for Nippers, IRB purchases, maintaining IRB's and medical costs. With much of this equipment used to save lives the aim is to avoid the risk of equipment failure during a rescue. A further \$8,569 was spent on a trailer, mercury engine and club house television.

With our patrolling members visible on our beach during weekends and public holidays many are also competing in Surf Lifesaving competitions at Branch, State and National levels where possible although this year we spent \$4,238 on competition costs. Another area of expenditure we see as beneficial has been the continued updates to the clubhouse. This year we spent \$6,789 on clubhouse improvements and maintenance, a large increase over 2019 where only \$1,844 was spent but it was identified that further investments were necessary in 2020. The following graph shows a comparison of total expenses for 2020 (\$353,751) in comparison to 2019 (\$314,629) as a percentage of total expense.



General expenses include wages for the bar and administration, club improvements, cleaning, insurance (which doubled in 2020), merchants fees and general repairs and maintenance). A new surf boat was purchased in 2020 and the depreciation costs increased from \$5,700 from \$13,700 in 2019 to \$19,400 in 2020. Clothing and merchandise was another key area of expenditure for the club. Whilst some of this expenditure generates revenues for the club through clothing sales not all purchases do as the club will often subsidise clothing for members that represent the club in competition. Clothing expenditure is greater than the revenue generated in 2020 due to the fact a large amount of clothing stock was purchased. A percentage of stock is subsidised by the club for members and volunteers. Clothing sales also generate little profit. This is done to keep costs for members purchasing these items down. By having members wearing club merchandise it assists in building awareness of the club within the local community.

A new surf boat was also purchased in 2020.

NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR

The club has used the strong growth of the recent financial years to invest in equipment that was required and to maintain the club house and existing equipment. This ensures we have sufficient surf lifesaving training and equipment available to our members, their families and our community. We strive to ensure we have adequate facilities and can provide the many competition and social activities for our members and the community to enjoy.

I would like to thank my fellow committee members who made these financial results possible. Without their dedication to maintaining revenues and managing our expenses so diligently we would not have achieved these positive financial results in such trying times.

BLACKMORES BILLY SWIM



The 13th of January dawned bright and sunny – which was a shame because the Bilgola ‘Billy’ Swim was the day before!

Paul Ellercamp from oceanswims.com observed that due to the conditions on the Sunday, most eastern Sydney beaches would not have gone ahead – but we’re made of sterner stuff on the Northern Beaches. Although we had less entrants than 2019 (512 vs 390) the weather the day before and the day of the Swim – intermittent rain, wind and large surf - would have put a lot of people off swimming.

We welcomed the Outside Broadcast of Community Radio 2RNB which added a layer of excitement to the day – between live crosses to the hosts from the start and finish line, to interviews of local politicians, lifesavers, swimmers and audience. We look forward to continuing this relationship between two forward-thinking community groups.

As usual, when we put out the call, our cohort of club volunteers stepped up to every task needed. From catering to clean-up, buoy-siting and placement to registration, each position and task was handled with skill and good humour – a reason why the Billy Swim is such a well-regarded event on the Northern Beaches.

The 500M Swim was started by Kylie Ferguson, NBC councillor and friend of Bilgola Surf Club. Tough conditions greeted the 300-odd swimmers, with over a dozen being picked up by IRBs and Jetski manned by Ricky Rodgers and Craig Poppleton. As per usual the other beaches that are part of the Pittwater Swim Series volunteer their IRBs and personnel to assist their neighbours’ swims – thanks to Newport, Avalon and Whale Beach for their provision.

Each swimmer has their own reason for challenging themselves with ocean swimming – ultimately it is about

the mind just as much as it is the body’s fitness. For people that are interested, the winning male swimmer in the 500M was Logan Kaye from North Turramurra and the first female swimmer was Lexi Harrison from Bilgola Plateau - Lexi went on to complete the double by also being the first woman out of the water in the 1500M.

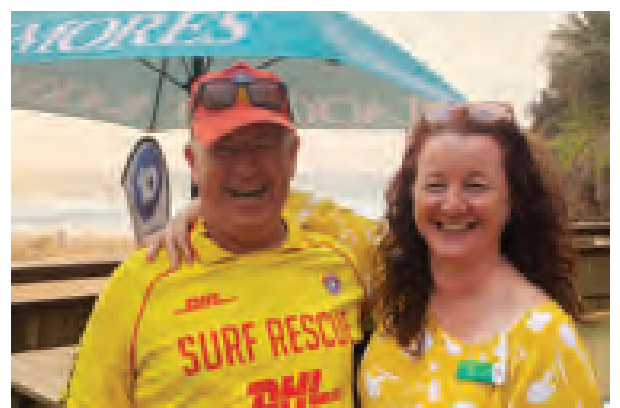
Steve Faddy, a Bilgola Club member and our ESO, must be congratulated for his handling of the event. In shifting and trying conditions, he managed the Swim in an exemplary manner, balancing the safety of the swimmers with their and the club’s determination to successfully complete the days swims. Additionally, Nicci Curtin, our stoic Assistant Swim Director made the hard things look easy and the impossible took just a smidge longer. Thank you both.

The 1500M was not a swim for the fainthearted. Between some quite large sets the age groups were started by SLS NSW President George Shales. Immediately, the surf seemed to get larger again – all but about 5 swimmers of the groups managed to negotiate the break – earlier sets had torn two of the buoys off their anchors – so the resilience and fortitude of all of the swimmers on the day must also be commended.

In the end – if results mattered – Ollie Signorini from Collaroy was the first male swimmer out of the water and – as noted earlier – Lexi Harrison was the first female. Congratulations goes not only to them but to all swimmers on the day, but also to all of the volunteers, officials and spectators that took part in a very special event. The last word goes to ex-Olympic swimmer Chris Fydler, who, after coming out of the water, commented to an official that “that was one of the more challenging ocean swims I have done”. Job done.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT



The 2019-20 patrolling season kicked off smoothly, but then things took an interesting turn. Australia encountered one of its worst bushfire seasons, our coastline was pounded by a series of extreme weather events, we saw localised flooding and extended power outages, culminating with the global pandemic of COVID-19 which prematurely ended our season. During each turn, Bilgola members responded, volunteering their time and proudly serving the community. Our skills were also tested throughout the short season with >10 water rescues conducted, all of which were swimmers who were struggling outside the flags.

OVERVIEW

The shortened 2019 season meant fewer patrolling hours, in fact 5,053 patrolling hours were undertaken at Bilgola where our prior year saw over 7,500 hours. Notwithstanding these reduced figures, we must acknowledge the complexity of the season, our members were asked to pivot from what may be considered normal duties and undertake tasks such as community welfare checks - ensuring the elderly were safe and healthy while extended power outages were impacting residents in Terrey Hills, and door knocking on residents throughout Warriewood to prepare for rising flood waters and potential evacuation. A rescue team is also available 24/7 for emergency callouts, allowing Bilgola to remain rescue ready and lend its support when needed. The above is only able to be achieved due to the commitment and generosity of the people who make up Bilgola SLSC.

PATROL CAPTAIN OF THE YEAR

Congratulations Romilly Madew.

Romilly provides a constant face of leadership at the club, her commitment to avail herself at short notice has guaranteed cover when patrols have been short. She is one of the first members to respond to club callouts for help. In addition, Romilly manages her patrol via highly effective and efficient communication, and provides briefings and continuous education for patrolling members before each patrol. Her patrol also maintained very high member attendance. Romilly's counsel and guidance to me during executive committee transition has enabled the club to continue its reputation as safe and successful family-oriented club. Thank you Romilly for your ongoing commitment.

PATROL OF THE YEAR

One of Bilgola's most successful, yet most challenging days is the Billy Swim. With so many competitors and spectators flooding to the beach vying for the opportunity to compete in the first event of the 2020 ocean swim season, we require a very structured approach to the day and especially to be on high alert. The Billy 2019 swim proved to be one of those days where the conditions were quite challenging and a number of competitors required support in the ocean. Patrol 9 was selected for duty on this day, having previously provided Ocean Swim coverage. Their role included land and sea support together with our water safety team and IRB's. The patrol prepared themselves in advance of this event and coordinated a number of support resources who together managed to provide an extremely safe environment for all swimmers, especially those who required that bit of extra help. Well done to the members of Patrol 9 and all involved.

The contribution from all our members is tallied at the conclusion of the season (in this case, a shortened season) and we celebrate those who have provided that extra time to providing a safe environment for public water safety. WORTHWHILE MENTION – SYDNEY NORTHERN BEACHES RESCUE OF THE MONTH NOMINEE

I remember being told that I was more likely to use my lifesaving skills away from the beach than on the beach – and this rang true for Oliver Festa. In September 2019 Oliver found himself in a position to render assistance and use his training to help a member of the public on a bus.

Incident overview

Bilgola SLSC member and year 11 Student (now year 12) at St Luke's, Oliver Festa, undoubtedly saved a man's life on Thursday 12 September while hopping onto the B-Line bus network. Oliver boarded the bus at Mona Vale on his way to school and found a man slumped over and unconscious at the rear of the top deck. Oliver alerted the driver and arranged for other travellers to

assist, placing the man into recovery position and closely monitoring his very faint breathing. Oliver tried to locate a pulse but it was very difficult to detect.

While waiting for the ambulance to arrive the man stopped breathing a number of times, and together with fellow club member and city commuter (Claire Reading), Oliver commenced CPR with a number of chest compressions. The compressions kept the man's blood flowing and assisted with keeping the man oxygenated. Suddenly a weak breath was detected and the man was placed back into the recovery position. Thankfully the ambulances arrived and took over, finding a low pulse of 49 and stabilising the patient with oxygen. There is no doubt the man's life was saved due to Oliver's actions on this morning.

IN CONCLUSION

I would first and foremost like to sincerely thank all of our patrolling members who give their time to ensure the beach is a safe place for all visitors. This is a huge commitment to make with so many competing priorities and especially with such a turbulent 2019-20 season.

As my first season in the role, I am also very grateful to the club's executive committee and leadership teams (past and present) for their support and guidance. It is the people who make a place like Bilgola SLSC so special and I look forward to our continued successes.

A final word of thanks for all those who attend our voluntary patrols at Christmas, the Boat Carnival and our Billy Swim. Volunteering time on these occasions is recognised and as such is especially appreciated.

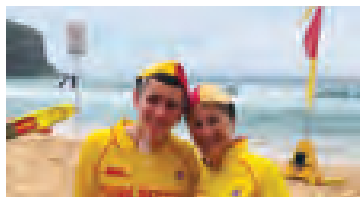

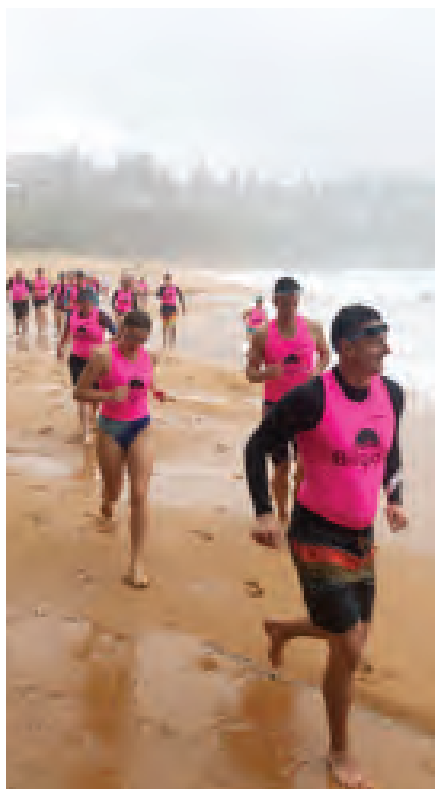

'Thinks he's Bogie' Award – Dave Edgley. Swanning around in Morocco in a Trench Coat when he should have been on patrol - "Here's looking at you, kid."

SURFBOAT & COMPETITION REPORT



Expectations were at an all time high at the beginning of the season. The clubs athletes had, last season, produced, two national gold medals, a state medal, branch medals and two representative teams.

The competition team, this year was comprised of one under 23 ladies crew, one reserve grade mens crew and one mens masters crew.

A small, tightly knit group, all reinvesting another year in the Bilgola club spirit.

As in recent years Bilgola SLSC hosted the first surfboat carnival of the year in early November. The clubs assistance and the input of our sponsors were well received by all. Moving on, to the Newport Carnival the Ladies reversed the placings to take the line honours from arch rivals Newport.

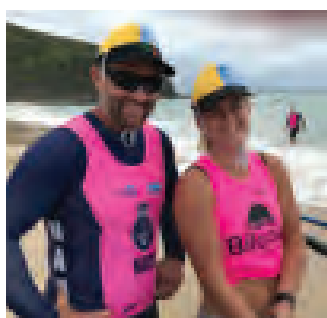
The Reserve crew backed up their win with second place, with the same result at Freshwater. The ladies did not compete at Freshwater.

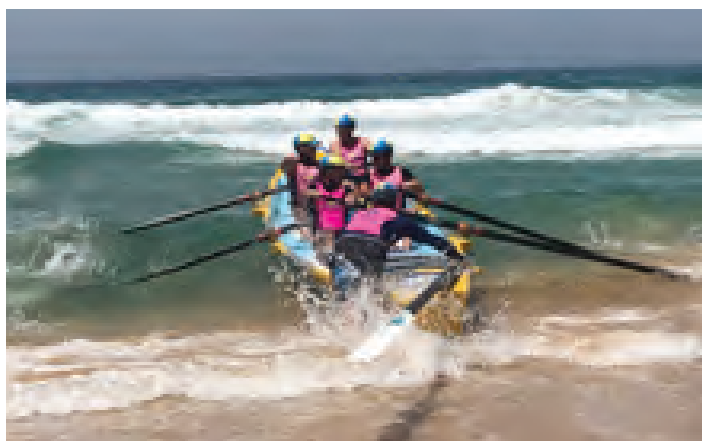

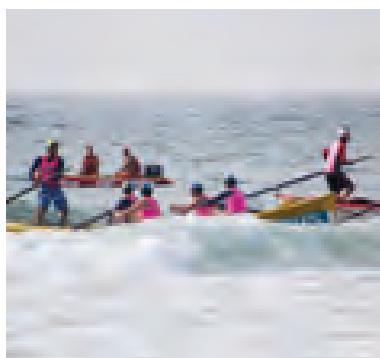

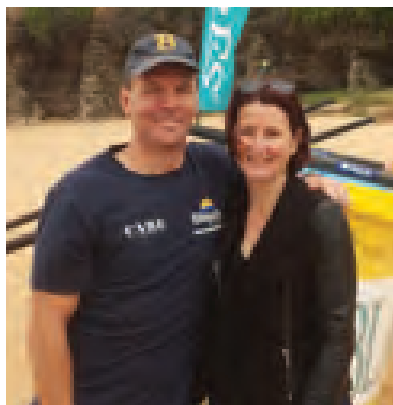

SURF EDUCATION

With the introduction of an age specific curriculum by SLISA in 2010, our Age Managers and Assistants have continued their application of this aspect of Nipper training whilst ensuring we retain the fun aspects of the Nipper Programme. Their weekly commitment and enthusiasm in supporting, encouraging and educating our most valuable assets, our kids, has been exemplary so my sincere thankyou to this team.

We saw many more Nippers round the buoy on board/swim for the first time with the gentle and positive encouragement from our Age Management Team.

Many nippers also enjoyed the deployment of the Aquatic Trampoline – again encouraging Nippers to swim beyond the break for the first time.

John Coleman gallantly guided our Surf Education Certificate (SRC) Nippers, which unexpectedly exploded in numbers from our usual 15 to 35. Unfortunately with many bad weather days through the season and the sudden halt of activities (they were a week out from assessment!) – they are yet to achieve their certificate, but hopefully very soon. We are very appreciative of the training help from Geoff Raper, Peter Fenley and Craig Poppleton and Rob Farr. It was also greatly assisted by Bronze/Nipper parents - Stuart Taggart, David Hogan and Kath McKenzie.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2020

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, Charitable Fundraising Act (NSW), Associations Incorporation Act and Australian Accounting Standards Board and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Membership fees received in advance of the current year will be brought to account as income in the appropriate year.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Taxes

Under the tax system, the Club was endorsed on 1 July 2000 by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) as an income tax exempt entity.

Fringe Benefits Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, was exempt from Fringe Benefits Tax under *Section 57A* of the *Fringe Benefits Assessment Act 1986*. No fringe benefits were paid as the Club did not employ staff during the reportable period.

Capital Gains Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, is exempt from Capital Gains Tax under *Section 50-5* of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

No provision is required for income tax as the Club's income is exempt.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation.

Property Leasehold Improvements, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the club during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of the recognition of the liability.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and cessation of all involvement in those goods.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue from fund raisings, donations, grants/subsidies, sponsorships is recognised at fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account the period of commitment. Income is recognized on accruals basis which is at the point income is committed, not received.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

Contingent Liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities that the committee members are aware of that will have material effects to the financial report.

Events Subsequent To Reporting Date

Since the end of the financial year, there are no material events that have come to the attention of the committee members that will have material impact on the financial report.

Financial Risk Management

The club's financial instruments consists mainly of deposits with banks, short-term investments, accounts receivable and payable.

Financial Risk Management Policies

The association treasurer's overall risk management strategy seeks to assist the club in meeting its financial targets, whilst minimising potential adverse effects on financial performance.

Risk management policies are approved and reviewed by the members committee on a regular basis. These included the credit risk policies and future cash flow requirements.

The main purpose of non-derivative financial instruments is to raise finance for company operations. The club does not have any derivative instruments.



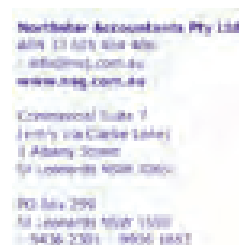


