## Bronze Medallion Fees

The training fee for new Bronze members over 18 years is \$200. For all new members under 18 years, the fee is \$150. This covers a 1-year membership, training manual, patrol uniform and cap. The fee is paid prior to training commencing. All under 18 years renewing members pay a registration fee of \$75 for all training which includes a 1-year membership (these people will already have their own uniform and training manual from SRC).

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT







Returning to a more “normal” operational year was greatly appreciated by our dedicated lifesavers. Utilization of full PPE was actioned when treating incident casualties on the few occasions when it was necessary along with social distancing but otherwise the return to full unrestricted lifesaving was beneficial to members mental and physical health.

There was no loss of life during the quieter than usual season (poor weather conditions). This is once again testament to the dedication of the active patrolling members who volunteered their service on the many bad and some good weather days.

The club ended up hosting only the Blackmores Billy Boat Carnival as the Blackmores Billy swim was initially cancelled (Tsunami warning), rescheduled then cancelled again (flood waters and pollution). The boat carnival was a great success with the competitors enjoying favorable conditions, comradery and fabulous competition with crews coming from as far as the South Coast.

Weather and surf conditions severely curtailed our Nipper program with our juniors participating in educational days around the sand dunes and rock shelves gaining valuable environment information and protection skills from a group of extremely dedicated Age Managers.

Our education group of trainers continued with their dedicated service of training our SRC group, Bronze Medallion, Advanced Resuscitation Certificate and IRB qualifications. Additionally, it is the continuing dedication of this group of volunteer trainers which enables Bilgola to ensure the skill sets of our patrolling members remain current and proficient. The Executive thanks all our trainers for their continuing efforts. This season our trainees who were affected by earlier Covid lockdowns were able to finally get their qualifications and congratulations must go to them for hanging in there through one of the longest training periods.

The club still operates in its premises under a “letter of comfort” from Northern Beaches Council whilst the new 20-year lease is being processed and passed by the Council to the Minister for Lands for signing. This is expected to be finalized in the forthcoming season.

The club has been successful in grant applications during the season for club improvements. A solar array will now be installed on roof to assist in offsetting greenhouse emissions and reduce the significant cost of energy purchases. Our Nipper board storage along with the IRB service areas will also be upgraded to enable better use of available limited space whilst enabling additional equipment to be stored more efficiently.

Blackmores as our major sponsor has continued its valuable support during the season and its continuing support is greatly appreciated in assisting with the financial viability of the club. Channel 10, Harris Farm and Ray White Palm Beach have also contributed significantly to our operations, and we thank them for their ongoing support.

Bilgola SLSC has again contributed towards the running of Branch activities with a solid group of volunteers dedicating many hours to Duty Officer roles, RWC Operations, Support Operations, Lifesaving Quality Standards along with Education activities of training and assessing.

The club extends its thanks to the Branch Executive and Staff for all their exceptional support during the season.

Bilgola SLSC runs efficiently thanks to its dedicated paid Support and Bar staff, and we extend our gratitude for their efforts over the past twelve months.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

The executive committee continues to strive to maintain and enhance the club's facilities and equipment and cannot do so without the generous support of all our members, the community and local authorities during our various fund-raising events and club activities held throughout the year. Thank you for your ongoing support.

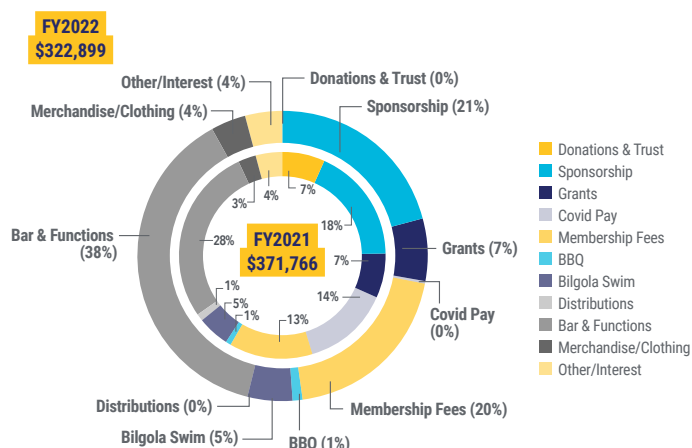
## FINANCIAL SUMMARY

This financial year was from the 1st July FY21 through to 30th June 2022 and the first time the year has been in line with the typical Australian financial year. All comparisons below are in comparison with the previous financial year (FY21), which was 13 months long enabling this alignment to occur (FY20 and before were June 1st through to May 31st).

Revenues generated in FY21 were \$322,899 which is 87% the revenue achieved in FY21 (\$371,766). This is an excellent outcome given that FY21 included \$50,900 of government incentives to assist in the running of the club (14% of revenue) and FY22 did not receive any similar revenue. Bar and functions made up 38% of the revenue in FY22, after being only 28% in FY21, 34% in FY20 and 43% in FY19 in pre-covid life. From the revenue earned the club has spent \$346,082 (FY21: \$279,381) across various club activities including purchasing and maintaining equipment and the facilities enjoyed by members. The end of year result was a profit of \$34,488 (FY21: \$92,384, FY20: -\$3,258, FY19: \$57,186, FY18: \$40,768). The retained earnings of the club was \$480,773 (FY21: \$446,284, FY20: \$353,901, FY19: \$357,159, FY18: \$299,973). The clubs cash position has increased again after a challenging FY22 year with cash deposits at the end of the financial year being \$348,969 (FY21: \$322,250, FY20: \$249,212, FY19: \$297,875, FY18: \$226,916).

The revenues highlighted in the following graph and the financial results for the year ended 30 June 2022 recorded in the Income Statement show continued strength in income derived from memberships, functions and our major fund-raising events.

## Core Revenue Streams FY21/FY22 Comparison



The graph above shows the FY2022 revenue stream (outside donut chart) in comparison to the FY21 revenue stream (inside donut chart). This clearly shows that sponsorship stayed constant, membership fees increased as membership was not provided for free for patrolling members this year. This graph also shows the absence of COVID payments that had accounted for 14% of revenue (\$50,900) in FY21. Bar and functions increased by 10% and is the biggest income stream. Note that membership fees included fees that members paid to take part in training and is not just revenue from membership.

## INCOME

Our revenue base for funding our expenditure primarily came from Bar and functions, membership subscriptions, sponsorship, donations, grants and fund-raising activities such as the Bilgola swim. Revenue this year (12 month period) was \$322,899 which is 13% lower than FY21 (a 13 month period). As the graph above shows, there has been some fluctuations in some of our revenue streams but there has been some consistency with merchandise, the Bilgola swim, BBQ and distributions. Our major sponsor Blackmores have continued their generous support providing funding for many upgrades to the clubs operational activities including the ongoing assistance to our Nippers program, beach safety and clubhouse maintenance (\$35,000). Other sponsorship from Network 10 (\$15,000), Belle Property Avalon (\$15,000) and Doog (\$1,364) have also provided sponsorship.

Our major fundraising events, the Bilgola swim along with our regular Sunday sessions, sippers and nippers BBQ were once again well supported by our local community, businesses and members. The Bilgola swim was unfortunately cancelled but the entry fee of the participants has been rolled forward to next year, so income next year will be impacted by this.



All these events are as important as each other in relieving the financial burden of funding the club's activities. The focus on events like the Sunday sessions not only contributes valuable revenue to the club it also assists in fostering a sense of community within the club and provides opportunities to grow our membership base.

During FY22 a number of grants were received. These grants were received from organisations such as Northern Beaches Council (\$8,439), Surf Life Saving Australia BSEF (\$15,000) and Surf Life Saving Australia Awards of Excellence (\$500). Grant revenue has decreased slightly in FY22 but are actively pursued during the year with a number of applications submitted.

Without the continued support from our member's contributions, sponsors, donors and function activities we could not remain a financially viable club. Annual membership fees are invaluable both for the club and especially for members, giving them access to latest club facilities and equipment. However, further assistance and support is required to ensure we can continue to provide benefits to our members and the community.

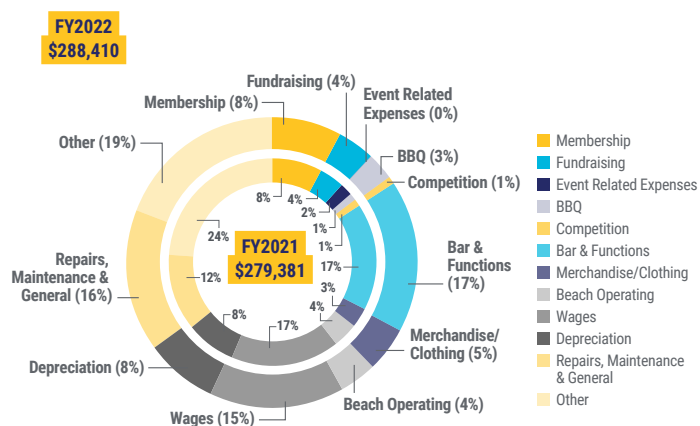
## EXPENSES

Our primary goal as a surf lifesaving club is to keep our beach safe for all swimmers and those who visit our shores. It can be costly to maintain our equipment to such a high standard together with providing ongoing training for our members. This year we spent \$10,284 on our beach operations which included IRB maintenance and medical costs. These costs are lower than the FY21 (\$11,672) they are below FY20 (\$43,300).

With our patrolling members visible on our beach during weekends and public holidays many are also competing in Surf Lifesaving competitions at Branch, State and National levels where possible although this year we spent \$2,990 on competition costs which is higher than the previous two years as competitions are starting again. Another area of expenditure we see as beneficial has been the continued general maintenance to the clubhouse and equipment. This year we spent \$46,175 on clubhouse and equipment repairs and maintenance. The following graph shows a comparison of total expenses for FY22 (\$288,410) in comparison to FY21 (\$279,381) as a percentage of total expense.

General expenses include, club improvements, cleaning, insurance, merchants fees) include wages for administration and bar. Depreciation costs

remained high at \$23,008 (\$21,869 FY21, \$19,400 FY20) to account for the capital purchases of the last few years. Clothing and merchandise was another key area of expenditure for the club. Whilst some of this expenditure generates revenues for the club through clothing sales not all purchases do as the club will often subsidise clothing for members that represent the club in competition or to club members and volunteers for events. Clothing expenditure is slightly higher than clothing revenue generated in FY22 due to the fact a large amount of clothing stock needs to be purchased across multiple sizes. There is a healthy stock of remaining clothing and the difference between purchased and sold is minimal.

## NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR

This year the club purchased some new boards but otherwise held off on major purchases. In order to have sufficient surf lifesaving training and equipment available to our members, their families and our community we will need to again invest in equipment in the coming financial year which will provide facilities for our members and the community to enjoy.

I would like to thank my fellow committee members who made these financial results possible. Without their dedication to maintaining revenues and managing our expenses so diligently we would not have achieved these positive financial results in such difficult and ever changing times.

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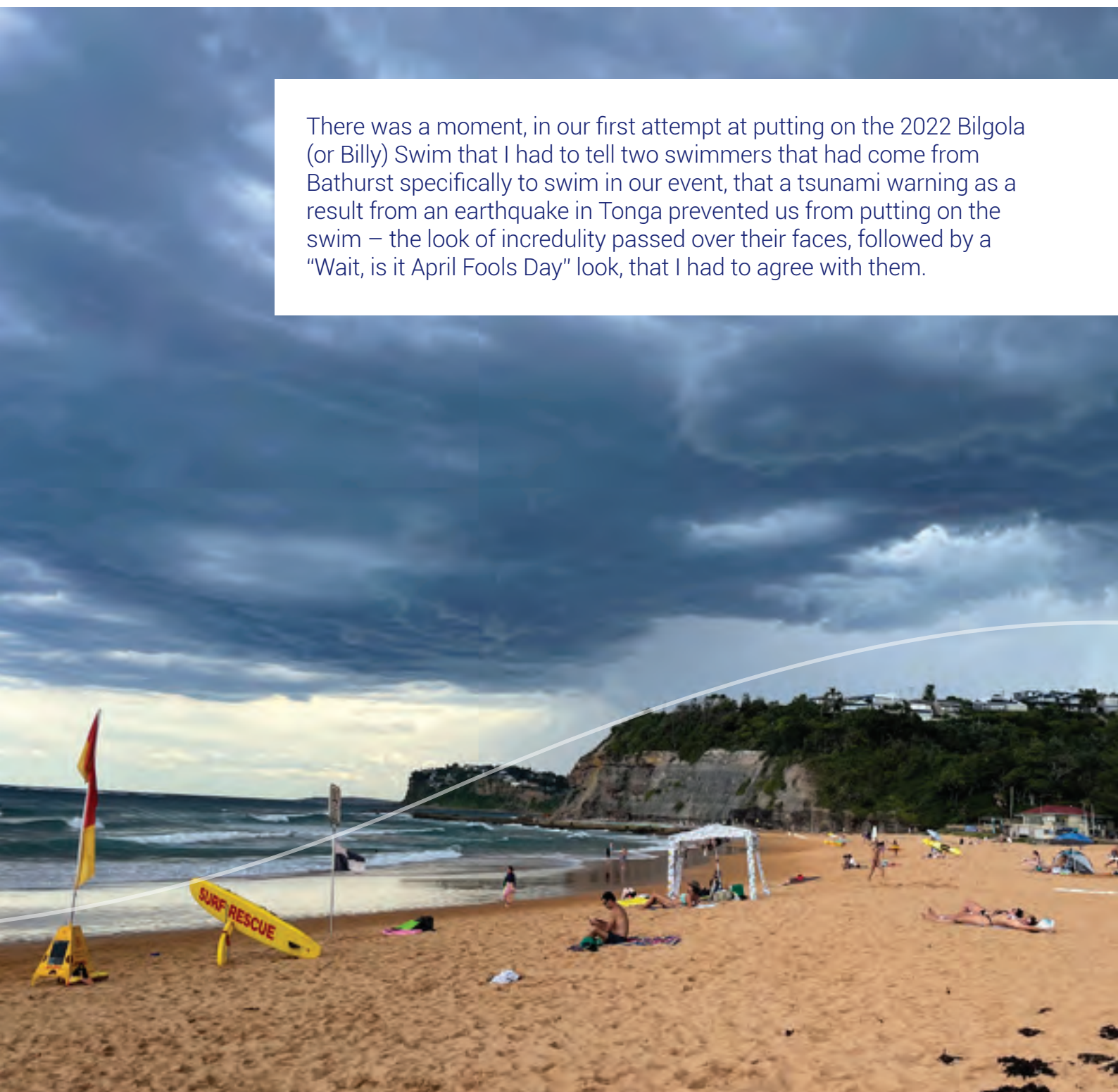






# BLACKMORES BILLY SWIM

There was a moment, in our first attempt at putting on the 2022 Bilgola (or Billy) Swim that I had to tell two swimmers that had come from Bathurst specifically to swim in our event, that a tsunami warning as a result from an earthquake in Tonga prevented us from putting on the swim – the look of incredulity passed over their faces, followed by a “Wait, is it April Fools Day” look, that I had to agree with them.





A Swim, that in my time as Swim Director had been postponed or cancelled for the following reasons:

Big surf,

Bad weather,

Pandemic,

and now a tsunami...

But wait, there's more.

Lastly flooding...

Sunday 13th March was the second date selected – about 780mm of rain fell between our first Swim date and the proposed second date.... when we were on patrol at Bilgola a week before the second attempt at the Swim we watched a ten metre tree beach itself along with various bits of furniture, whitegoods and vegetation, I knew that we were doomed – there was to be no Billy Swim in season 2021/22.

I must pay tribute to the swimmers that had entered the initial Swim, hung on for the second attempt and now are waiting to hear when will hold the third attempt at the Swim (hint: late September). We have had only 2 swimmers request a refund as both were moving to the other side of the world.

I also must thank all of the Bilgola personnel that volunteered for the Swim(s) – you front up on the nominated date with good humour, fulfill your role – IRB, Water Safety, Barbeque, Registration, Start and Finish – wait around for confirmation of cancellation and then go home! Thank you for your efforts!

On a serious note, I would like to thank our assistant Swim Director Nikki Curtin, our course setter and IRB wrangler Bill Hawkins, our media partner Radio Northern Beaches and our neighbouring beaches - Avalon, Newport, Whale Beach, Palm Beach and Mona Vale – who are all members of the Pittwater Swim Series and assist with IRB support.

# CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT



The members of Bilgola SLSC can stand tall in 2022 as we regrouped to provide beachgoers with another safe season of beach attendance. While prior years had us entangled in complexity and strict rules, with suburban borders and explicit travel restrictions, it is fair to say that we had a reasonable level of autonomy on the beach in season 2021-22.

Our members had to patrol through a period of mandatory mask wearing, but when this was lifted, we managed to reconnect and lift in a way more familiar to being a volunteer lifesaver, with our mates, our loved ones, with family and the community, enjoying all that Bilgola Beach has to offer.

The headwinds we faced during this season were more of natural disaster, where Surf Lifesaving as an Emergency Service agency, was called to action to provide disaster relief and support to those in need. Unprecedented rainfall early in 2022 saw many people impacted and evacuated from their homes without too much warning. This led to a series of Emergency Rescue callouts requests by Surf Lifesaving. Bilgola has a dedicated Emergency Callout Crew made up of a mix of volunteers. I wish to acknowledge the entire callout team made up of the following members: Lucy Brogden, Dave Burton, Zac Cracknell, Josh Farr, Peter Fenley, Emanuel Freer, Andrew Gough, Bill Hawkins, Dave Madew, Romilly Madew, Rachael Peet, Craig Poppleton, Ray Trevisan, Jarrah Turner and yours truly.

Bilgola played a significant role during this period, providing flood evacuation support to those residents most impacted, including public liaison duties within Emergency Services management. And when we all thought it was over, we experienced further heavy rain in July 2022 leading to rapid flooding with similar evacuation orders and the need for welfare support by way of food drops to remote communities cut off once again by rising flood waters. We are honoured and proud of those who focus on giving so much to the community especially during such times of need. Thank you.

In contrast to the previous season, you will note higher number of patrolling hours recorded by our lifesaving members with more hours spent on the beach, but as many will tell you, a lot of those trying to stay dry!!

## Overview

Lifesaving as a movement has approximately 180,000 volunteers who help to keep our beaches safe for visiting members of the public. Just consider that number, what a truly amazing act of generosity. All these people giving to their communities without any expectation, but for the greater good of the people.

It was mentioned last year and continues to remain valid, *"the success of Bilgola SLSC is only able to be achieved due to the commitment and generosity of the people who give themselves without any expectation"*.

Something significant for me this season is to really acknowledge all of those who are not directly involved with Lifesaving activities, they are the quiet supporters, perhaps behind the scene, those who are encouraging their wife, husband, son or daughter, a guardian, a loved one, a partner and any other relation who is away during those periods on patrol, or Emergency Rescue callouts. 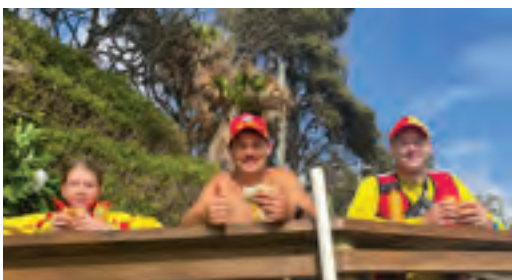

# IRB CAPTAIN'S REPORT



The IRB cohort were back in strength early in the season, aiming to start a new Crew and Drivers course in early September – though curtailed by COVID 19 restrictions – (remember that?), but we couldn't hit the water until early October. This was the first course that we'd been able to run since February 2020 – some candidates from this course couldn't make the previous assessment (looking at you, GW) – 679 days from the start of that course to this season's assessment date – we've had motors not last that long!

These 17 club members that passed this December 2021 assessment must be acknowledged for their commitment to the training, as we had to navigate (sorry) the waves (sorry again) of requirements and regulations from various authorities and agencies.

I would like to acknowledge and thank the IRB Training team, as their efforts help secure our future Crew and Drivers – Marc Bernard, Zac Cracknell, Jarrah Turner and Josh Farr – your efforts and commitment have allowed the club to train Bilgola surf lifesaving personnel to very high standards.

Again, we have been fortunate in getting support from the Bilgola Committee where we were able to purchase a new motor to add to our group? roar? chug? of motors, along with a few new Life Jackets, particularly Small and Medium sizes, reflecting the influx of younger male and female club members that are taking up IRBs. Our mainstay personnel are mainly middle-aged (and, in my case, grumpy) males, but, going forward, to help with the longevity and dynamism of the club is to have this injection of young people and help us to 'stay young' ourselves. I'd also like to again acknowledge two young members in Jarrah Turner and Josh Farr. Both young men have stepped up in training and operating roles (including jetskis), allowing us with old bones to step back gracefully and gratefully.

In March 2022, a number of the Bilgola Emergency Response Team got tasked to assist with flood work in western Sydney and Southern Highlands. Zac Cracknell, Andrew Gough, Greg Wood and myself fronted up for action – though, in the process, a ute was lost, egos dented and IRBs came back unused. Andrew and Greg, though, were successfully deployed at Wisemans Ferry, helping to move residents from flooded houses. A late entry to our rescue cohort is Bill Hawkins and (again) Zac, who managed to become TV stars on their way to rescuing people!

Once again, the IRB cohort fronted up to every patrol, whether our beloved Bilgola was open or not, sunny or raining. This assurance of being present soaks through each patrol and creates a great 'backbone'. All Drivers and Crew were also willing to 'push the boat out' both physically and metaphorically.

A quick note on a couple of beloved IRB folk in further flung fields – having moved up to the mid-North Coast Kaz Marks and Nigel Penn (also a Bilgola Life Member) have been busy representing Bilgola as officials in the NSW IRB Racing circuit – the most exciting activity you can have on water! Thanks very much Nige and Kaz – and we miss your wild (Nige) and sensible (Kaz) personalities around the club!

The late season ALBERT Course held at Dee Why Surf Club in early May was supposed to challenge IRBs and C and Ds in large surf to include wave attack, launch and rescue techniques – however the hope of large waves was sorely bereft – nevertheless the course was a great success allowing participants to re-think and practice new techniques in launch and rescue techniques and different ways of attacking waves. We hope to see some of these techniques and practices flow through to the Bilgola cohort when we hold our 'ALBERT-Lite' training days early in season 2022/23.

In all, season 2021/22 was a splendid testament to the resilience of the IRB Drivers and Crew but also to all Bilgola surf lifesavers. After the past few years that kept us apart, it was gratifying to celebrate the common cause that draw us together. Thank you all for your contribution.

# NIPPER'S REPORT



A season like no other is one way you could describe this past year. The combination of La Nina and Covid-19 would repeatedly test the resilience of the Juniors group - impacting our ability to run a full Nipper program. Despite these challenges we managed to deploy a new coastal education programme, start a second mid week training session, run 3 club championships, and four major social events.

## Education

The primary aim of the Nipper program is to provide children with basic surf skills and a pathway to becoming qualified lifesavers and junior competitors. A large part of this is the age specific curriculum which has been operational since 2010. In addition to this, age managers Scott Machar, Conrad Grayson, and Alex Miller developed a set of coastal and marine environment modules specifically for Bilgola. These were trialled for the first time this year. They proved invaluable on several of the days when the beach was closed and will be further developed in coming seasons.

Part of these coastal modules included snorkelling activities. The club invested in quality masks and snorkels to provide the opportunity for accessing rock pools and shelves around Bilgola. The extreme weather impacted this component - restricting its delivery significantly this season. It will be offered again next year where we hope to increase the participant numbers significantly.

We also started a second mid week water training session for U9s and above. This was in addition to the Monday competitor only session. Thanks to John Coleman and his cadet crew for providing water safety and providing this opportunity for our kids. Its impact on the juniors who attended was clearly visible by the end of the season.

Delivering the education program, supporting and ensuring the kids have fun at the same time, while managing a constantly changing beach environment is no easy task. Once again our team of Age Managers & Assistants, water safety and Cadets did a fantastic job - often under very adverse conditions. Thank you all!

The SRC (Surf Rescue Certificate) programme was led by Zac Cracknel under Peter Fenley's guidance, with support from trainer Emmanuel Freer and age managers Jen Hopkins & Jamie De Uriarte. Despite the extra challenges presented by extreme weather all course participants



passed on their first assessment. Great work by the team and congratulations to this cohort as they graduate from Nippers and move to the Cadet programme.

### Club Championships

We only just managed to complete 3 club championship rounds. With 4 delays due to beach closures, the final round was completed just 2 weeks from season end. Thanks to Karen Perry for dealing with the collation of points and organising awards under such tight deadlines.

A lot of work goes on behind the scenes to make club championships happen. Once again thank you to the Junior Committee, our wonderful Age Managers & assistants, water safety Cadets, and parents who made it possible. The conditions for some of these rounds were to put it mildly - extreme!

### Competition & Carnivals

With my predecessor Karen Perry focusing on the clubs competition and carnival participation we saw the number of Bilgola Nippers participating in carnivals grow significantly from previous years.

We had over 25 sign up for competition this year after completing their open water proficiencies, up by more than 20 from previous years! Throughout the season we had between 8 to 15 competitors from all age groups for

each of the carnivals depending on whether sand, water or combined.

It was fantastic to see the U9s/U10s rise up, with some amazing results from the likes of Cora Heath, Madeleine Gough, Sophie Spencer, Jade Mitchell, and of course Frankie Boulter whom had an astonishing win and gold medal in the Northern Beaches Branch U9 Flags.

Our U11/12s were again well represented by Juliette Liell, Sofia Hole, Lyla Rosser, Mia Preston, Mica Spencer, Chloe Erskine and Amelie Preston with all of them making finals at at least one of the carnivals.

U13/14s were represented by Taylor Grayson, Sophie Mitchell, Sam Freer and Fletcher Hole again all making us proud with solid results.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2022

## Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, Charitable Fundraising Act (NSW), Associations Incorporation Act and Australian Accounting Standards Board and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

## Membership fees

Membership fees received in advance of the current year will be brought to account as income in the appropriate year.

## Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

## Taxes

Under the tax system, the Club was endorsed on 1 July 2000 by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) as an income tax exempt entity.

## Fringe Benefits Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, was exempt from Fringe Benefits Tax under *Section 57A of the Fringe Benefits Assessment Act 1986*. No fringe benefits were paid as the Club did not employ staff during the reportable period.

## Capital Gains Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, is exempt from Capital Gains Tax under *Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

No provision is required for income tax as the Club's income is exempt.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2022

## Property

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation.

## Property Leasehold Improvements, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

## Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the club during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of the recognition of the liability.

## Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

## Comparative Figures

The comparative figures are not presented in this report since the last year balances cover 13 months from 01 June 2020 until 30 June 2021. With this regard, it is incomprehensible to compare the current year's balances with the last year figures.



# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2022

## Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and cessation of all involvement in those goods.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue from fund raisings, donations, grants/subsidies, sponsorships is recognised at fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account the period of commitment. Income is recognized on accruals basis which is at the point income is committed, not received.

## Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

## Contingent Liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities that the committee members are aware of that will have material effects to the financial report.

## Events Subsequent To Reporting Date

Since the end of the financial year, there are no material events that have come to the attention of the committee members that will have material impact on the financial report.

## Financial Risk Management

The club's financial instruments consists mainly of deposits with banks, short-term investments, accounts receivable and payable.

## Financial Risk Management Policies

The association treasurer's overall risk management strategy seeks to assist the club in meeting its financial targets, whilst minimising potential adverse effects on financial performance.

Risk management policies are approved and reviewed by the members committee on a regular basis. These included the credit risk policies and future cash flow requirements.

The main purpose of non-derivative financial instruments is to raise finance for company operations. The club does not have any derivative instruments.






