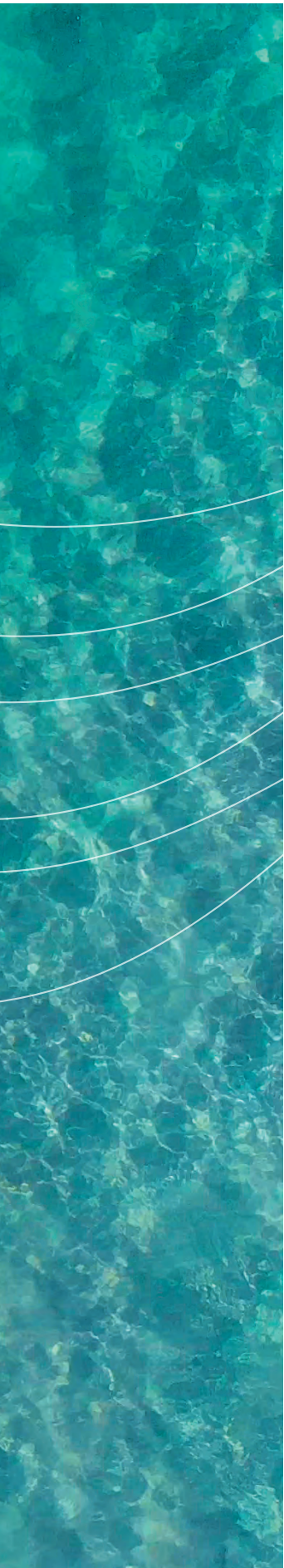

BRONZE MEDALLION FEES

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



This season has been one of the most challenging, not only for Bilgola SLSC, but all surf clubs within Sydney Northern Beaches region. Covid-19 hit not just once but twice in the Pittwater region during the season forcing our dedicated lifesavers away from their rostered weekends – especially those many members who do not live within the local region and travel down from the Kur-ring-gai area. To those members who did decide to travel into our “Avalon” bubble and undertake duties our club is especially thankful.



Bilgola SLSC is proud to report that once again we have been able to close off the season with no loss of life during patrol hours. Testament to the dedication and vigilance of the patrolling members.

Covid-19 “Avalon” lockdown meant that Bilgola SLSC was unable this year to open the “boat” season as has traditionally been done for many years. The club looks forward to once again hosting the first carnival of the season in 2021-2022 season. On the positive side our Men's Masters crew brought home Bronze

medals for their efforts at Aussies.

Our annual Blackmores “Billy” swim was initially postponed from January during the lockdown into the mid-April Autumn sunshine and was well patronised with all the participants passing on very positive feedback. We will, of course, be scheduling the swim back to our normal date in January 2022.

Thanks must go to David Madew (who organised the event twice!), Nikky Curtin and all the volunteers that ensured the day was a success.



The training team who had full SRC and Bronze groups ready for assessment at the end of 2019 season that missed out on assessment due to COVID-19 re-commenced refresher training as well as full training of additional SRC and Bronze candidates throughout this season with all candidates being successful. Thanks to Rowan Jacob, David Madew, Zac Cracknell and our CTO, Emanuel Freer for their monumental efforts. The workload that these folk give in training our lifesaving cohort is invaluable in ensuring that the patrol numbers are well maintained.

Karen Perry and her Nipper Committee have undertaken a stellar job co-ordinating the re-start of "split" Nippers each Sunday morning follow the easing of lockdown restrictions. "Split" Nippers meant the normal running time was doubled each Sunday morning which asked a lot from our dedicated volunteers. Our numbers held up despite some early fears that there may be a drop off due to Covid restrictions and all our Nippers once again gained invaluable water skills whilst having a whole heap of fun. Karen steps down this season as Chairperson and she has done a fantastic job with the Nipper Committee over the past few years. We welcome Michael O'Sullivan as the new Chair and thank Karen wholeheartedly for her monumental effort.

The club Executive and Committee has recently undertaken a strategic review and is in the process of finalising its forward three year plan. This will be published on the website when signed off.

Blackmores have continued to support Bilgola SLSC during this very difficult season and their contribution to the club is enormously appreciated. The club also appreciates support from Ray White Palm Beach, Harris Farm, Channel 10 and Adrenalin. All sponsorships help contribute to the financial viability of Bilgola SLSC and is deeply and sincerely recognised.

As can be seen from the financial reports the club is in a very viable and stable position as a result of extremely tight controls on expenditure, grants, sponsorships and limited income generated through the functions that we were able to proceed with over the season (especially Saturday Sippers!).

Like all surf clubs, Bilgola SLSC would be nothing without its members who are focused on the core business of lifesaving. Thanks must go to all our lifesavers but also all our other volunteers at Nippers, the Blackmores Billy Swim, training support, water safety and facility maintenance. Support staff must also be recognised as they ensure that administration and facility security is always maintained.

As we head into our third lockdown and with gear inspection preparation well underway, the forthcoming 2021 – 2022 season may be much the same or then again may be completely different but regardless the executive is ready for the challenge.

As President I must thank all the Executive and Committee members for their continued support whose efforts have made a difficult season enjoyable and I look forward to working together again over the next twelve months.

Congratulations to Kirk Jansen on attaining his twenty five year service award. Many other service awards were achieved this year and they will be presented at the annual Presentation night in August.

Finally, extra special thanks must go to our past president Romily Madew who's is stepping back from the Committee after many, many years of dedicated contribution. She will be continuing to lead her patrol but is taking on duties at a Branch level as a Duty Officer and Support Operations Co-advisor.

TREASURER'S REPORT

After another very tough year, the executive committee continues to strive to maintain and enhance the club's facilities and equipment and cannot do so without the generous support of all our members, sponsors, the community and local authorities during our various fund-raising events and club activities held throughout the year. Thank you for your ongoing support.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

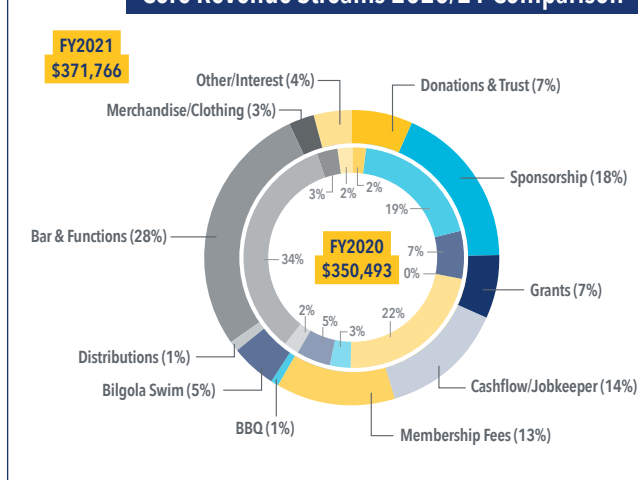
The financial year of FY2021 was 13 months, from June 1st 2020 to June 30th 2021. This financial year was lengthened to move the club to the normal financial year at the direction of SLSNSW. All comparisons below are in comparison with the previous financial year, which was only 12 months.

Revenues generated in FY2021 were \$371,766 which is 106% the revenue achieved in 2020 (\$350,493). This is an excellent outcome given that the FY2019 revenue was \$391,983 and bar and functions made up 43% of the revenue in 2019, only 34% in 2020 (as most functions ceased in mid-March 2020) and only 28% of the revenue in 2021. From the \$371,766 in revenue earned the club has spent \$279,381 (2020: \$353,752) across various club activities including purchasing and maintaining equipment and the facilities enjoyed by members. The end of year result was a profit of \$92,384 (2020: - \$3,258, 2019: \$57,186, 2018: \$40,768). The retained earnings of the club was \$446,284 (2020: \$353,901, 2019: \$357,159, 2018: \$299,973). The clubs cash position has increased again after a challenging 2020 year with cash deposits at the end of the financial year being \$322,250 (2020: \$249,212, 2019: \$297,875, 2018: \$226,916).

The revenues highlighted in the following graph and the financial results for the year ended 30 June 2021 recorded in the Income Statement show continued strength in income derived from memberships, functions and our major fund-raising events. The graph below shows the FY2021 revenue stream (outside donut chart) in comparison to the FY2020 revenue stream (inside donut chart). This clearly shows that sponsorship stayed constant, membership fees reduced as membership was not paid by patrolling members and Jobkeeper and other COVID payments accounted for 14% of revenue (\$50,900). Bar and functions reduced significantly but the initiative of Sippers was a large source of this income.

Note that membership fees included fees that members paid to take part in training and is not just revenue from membership.

INCOME

Our revenue base for funding our expenditure primarily came from Bar and functions, membership subscriptions, sponsorship, government top up due to covid, donations, grants and fund-raising activities such as the Bilgola swim. Revenue this year (13 month period) was \$371,766 which is 6% higher than 2020 (a 12 month period). As the graph above shows, there has been some fluctuations in some of our revenue streams but there has been some consistency with merchandise, the Bilgola swim, BBQ and distributions. Our major sponsor Blackmores has continued their generous support providing funding for many upgrades to the clubs operational activities including the ongoing assistance to our Nippers program, surf boat sponsorship, beach safety, clubhouse maintenance and lifesaving equipment. Other sponsorship from Network 10, Ray White Palm Beach and PBS Building have also provided sponsorship income to be used for specific equipment that has been required by the club.

Our major fundraising events, the Bilgola swim along with our regular Sunday sessions, sippers and nippers BBQ were once again well supported by our local community, businesses and members while they were able to be attended. All these events are as important as each other in relieving the financial burden of funding the club's activities. The focus on events like the Sunday sessions not

only contributes valuable revenue to the club it also assists in fostering a sense of community within the club and provides opportunities to grow our membership base.

Donations are very special to us and provide a personal way for members and non-members to support the club. This year we again received income from the trust fund bequeathed to the club by our past long-standing member Bob De Groot. We also received donations from the Rydge Foundation and K Oxborrow. No matter how large or small the donations we receive every dollar does indeed help, so again we thank all our donors for their continued support. Donations are also tax deductible due to the club being a non-profit organisation with "Deductible Gift Recipient" status.

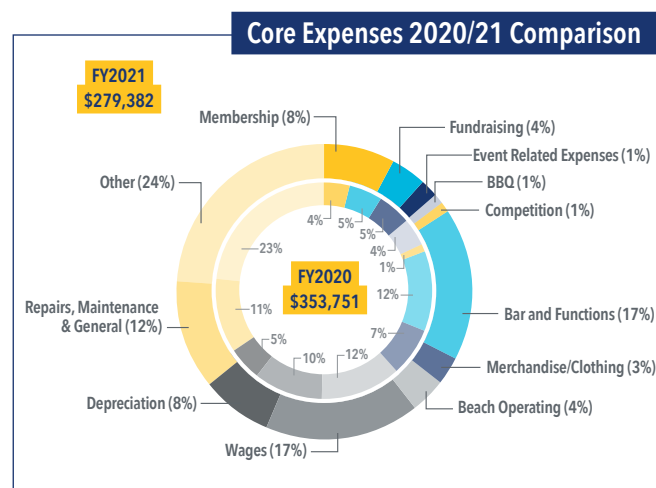
During 2021 a number of grants were received. These grants were received from organisations such as Northern Beaches Council, Department of Infrastructure, Surf Life Saving Australia and Surf Life Saving NSW. Grant revenue has increased in 2021 and was actively pursued during the year with a number of applications submitted.

Without the continued support from our member's contributions, sponsors, donors and function activities we could not remain a financially viable club. Annual membership fees are invaluable both for the club and especially for members, giving them access to latest club facilities and equipment. However, further assistance and support is required to ensure we can continue to provide benefits to our members and the community.

EXPENSES

Our primary goal as a surf lifesaving club is to keep our beach safe for all swimmers and those who visit our shores. It can be costly to maintain our equipment to such a high standard together with providing ongoing training for our members. This year we spent \$11,672 on our beach operations which included mainly IRB maintenance and medical costs.

With our patrolling members visible on our beach during weekends and public holidays many are also competing in Surf Lifesaving competitions at Branch, State and National levels where possible although this year we spent \$1,875 on competition costs which is well down on other years. Another area of expenditure we see as beneficial has been the continued general maintenance to the clubhouse and equipment. This year we spent \$33,661 on clubhouse and equipment repairs and maintenance. The following graph shows a comparison of total expenses for 2021 (\$279,381) in comparison to 2020 (\$353,751) as a percentage of total expense.



General expenses include, club improvements, cleaning, insurance, merchants fees and wages include wages for administration and bar. Depreciation costs remained high at an increased \$21,869 in 2021 in comparison to \$19,400 in 2020. Clothing and merchandise was another key area of expenditure for the club. Whilst some of this expenditure generates revenues for the club through clothing sales, not all purchases do, as the club will often subsidise clothing for members that represent the club in competition or to club members and volunteers for events. Clothing expenditure is greater than the revenue generated in 2020 due to the fact a large amount of clothing stock was purchased and clothing sales generate little profit. Once the free clothing is taken into account the clothing income is less than expenditure. This is done to keep costs for members purchasing these items down. By having members wearing club merchandise it assists in building awareness of the club within the local community.

NEXT FINANCIAL YEAR

This year the club held off on major purchases as the financial outlook was uncertain and significant purchases had been made the previous year. In order to have sufficient surf lifesaving training and equipment available to our members, their families and our community we will need to again invest in equipment in the coming financial year which will provide facilities for our members and the community to enjoy.

I would like to thank my fellow committee members who made these financial results possible. Without their dedication to maintaining revenues and managing our expenses so diligently we would not have achieved these positive financial results in such difficult and ever changing times.



For once - after the past few years - a beautiful morning greeted our swimmers and volunteers - late Autumn in the Northern Beaches - crisp morning, warm water, still calm day - is a treasure that is to be relished. A smaller swim crowd went off in a staggered start, two by two, ensuring that we didn't 'crowd the start line' meaning that the traditional dash to the water and the sight of a wading cohort of swimmers didn't happen. This however did not mean we had pedestrian finishes.

In the 500M, Peter Thiel, who started behind Sean Daly and Jordan Henry - showed the reason why ocean swimming is more than straight out speed - caught a wave that carried him past the 2nd and 3rd placegetters to sweep to victory. 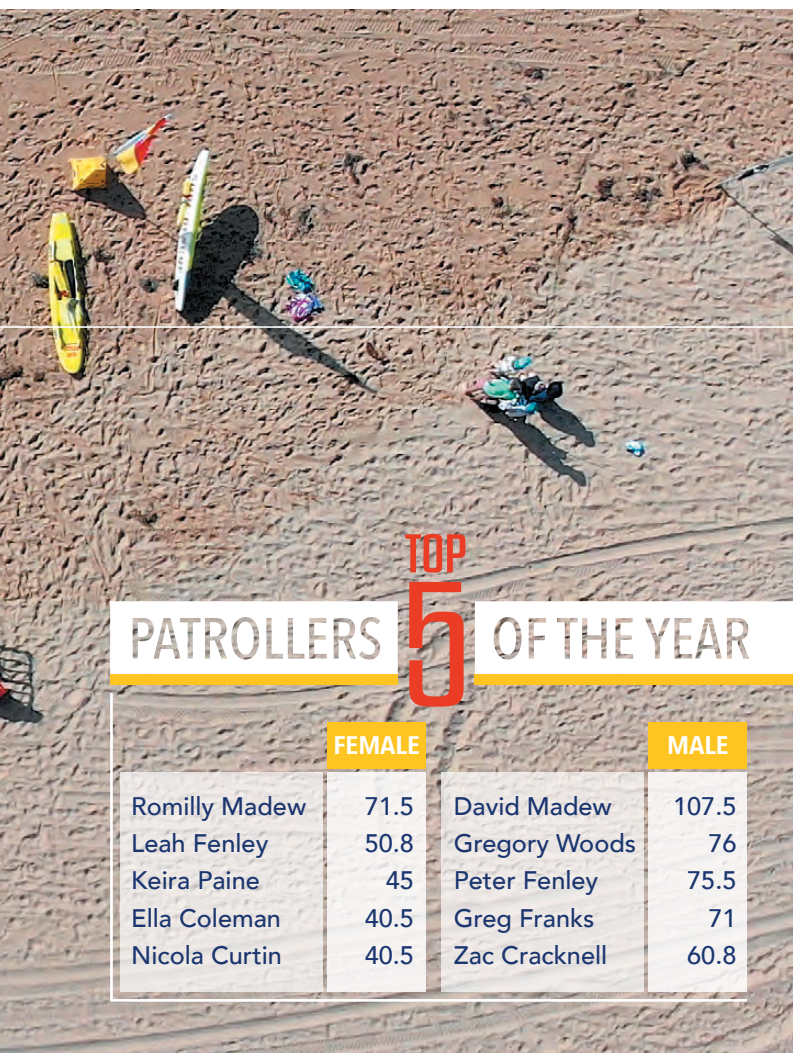


We were thrown into lockdown and unable to host our regular Christmas celebrations at Bilgola which we've become so accustomed to. For many, they had to assess their own risk appetite, whether caring for elderly members at home, or themselves needing to

stay away. Throughout the season, we came together and helped one another. There was that continuous small group providing additional hours to cover lean patrols, and we saw ourselves called into action as an Emergency Service agency when flooding saw our callout crew attend the Colo River to support those in need. It has been by far, a more challenging season but the spirit of Bilgola has stood the test. Thank you all for your immense support, feedback and input, your time generosity, patience, response to change and willingness to get involved.

OVERVIEW

Perhaps I'll start with how I finished last season, "the success of Bilgola SLSC is only able to be achieved due to the commitment and generosity of the people who give themselves without any expectation". This same sentiment can be said for the start of the season. And



while starting the season meant a whole new look and feel to social interaction, I was really encouraged by the willingness for patrolling members, especially our patrol captains, to take up the challenge and ensure the safety and wellbeing of their crew, making sure Bilgola SLSC was compliant with our expected new ways of patrolling while ensuring beach visitors went home safely each day. Even before the start of the season, we delivered a heavy volume of information outlining new procedures and new patient treatments. Balancing this with the use of sanitiser, masks, gloves and disinfectant coupled to our ability to respond to public health orders, demonstrated once again the spirit and determination of Bilgola.

David was instrumental in our pre-season planning to develop a COVID safe framework and reference material for use on patrol. This was critical for Bilgola to ensure member safety was front and centre while adopting safe practices and consistency throughout patrols. Thank you, David.





PATROL CAPTAIN OF THE YEAR

Congratulations to Marc Bernard from Patrol 4 on receiving this award. Marc has managed to balance several responsibilities while putting in a huge effort to pull his team together in a way that can only be described as a turnaround. A patrol is only as strong as its weakest link and the members of Patrol 4 can stand proud after participating in such a solid season. Marc managed to unite their focus, achieve a full complement of patrols while himself being able to satisfy his additional SLS Branch responsibilities as a Jetski Operator for Sydney Northern Beaches. Marc has enabled this greater focus through the appointment of a very well-deserved deputy Patrol Captain, Zac Cracknell, with the entire patrol delivering above and beyond the call. Congratulations and thank you Marc for the tremendous leadership this season with your crew.

PATROL OF THE YEAR

Continuing on from our Patrol Captain of the year, the award this season for Patrol of the year goes to those crew members from Patrol 4. During the season, I will try and get down to meet with the patrols, partly just to check in and say G'day, but I have also had to increase the frequency with all of the changes thrown at us due to COVID. The crew from patrol 4 have approached each of their rostered patrols with a very positive mindset, leaning into the additional tasks required of crews, and doing it with a renewed sense of purpose. There has been a very noticeable change from a patrol which was challenged to make its attendance numbers the prior season, to this season really delivering a united and positive approach. TOP FIVE PATROLLERS

The club recognises the top five female and top five male patrollers based on their recorded hours of service throughout the season. The contribution from all our members is tallied at the conclusion of the season (once again it was a disrupted season) and we celebrate those who have provided that extra time to providing a safe environment for public water safety. Congratulations to our top 5 female and male recipients.

The club is extremely grateful to George for his time and care

with restoring the reel which has now taken pride and place within the clubhouse bar. Thank you, George, and congratulations, Patrol 2.

We were fortunate to take possession of a new Thundercat III last January with a new motor – a considerable expense that the Club took on during a time of reduced income through no functions in the clubhouse. I'd like to thank the Bilgola

Committee for funding the IRB's purchase - we promise that we'll look after it, drive it carefully and clean it out after every time we flip it!

Recently we have started to name our IRBs after a deserving club person – this one was no exception. Bob Machar, a Bilgola Life Member, has given freely and frequently of his time and efforts, even to this day, where he still cuts the lawns, looks after the gardens and in general



cares for a club that has been part of his life for a long time. I would urge people to bail Bob up if you run into him at the club – he is a delight to talk to and we are fortunate to have such a link to earlier times at our club. Everyone at the club and during Nippers operations, kept their enthusiasm and understanding whilst ensuring we were operating under COVID-19 rules and procedures for which we are very grateful.

Even within this climate, we retained our Nippers numbers, keeping to just over

200 Nippers, very even between boys and girls all working towards developing a skills base for not only personal safety whilst in the surf but also gaining the skills to become Bilgola's next generation of young life savers.

SURF EDUCATION

With the introduction of an age specific curriculum by SLSA in 2010, our Age Managers and Assistants have continued their application of this aspect of Nipper training whilst ensuring we retain the fun

SRC/CADET REPORT



2019 SRC

It was a busy year of training for our SRC & Cadets. We had the backlog of our 2019 SRC to clear, who were a week from assessment last season when COVID stopped us. Notably the group were the fastest run/swim of the day and the assessors complimented the group on how well trained they were, so well-done Emmanuel. Thanks also to Peter Fenley and Zac Cracknell who helped out with their training and on their assessment day.

Our newly qualified cadets, eager to begin patrolling, were nearly disrupted by COVID a second time during the Avalon outbreak, however, Club Captain Adrian Wegrzyn, keen to get our new Cadets patrolling as soon as possible, was able to figure out a pathway for them to get their new uniforms and onto the beach with their new patrols. 2020 SRC

Meanwhile our 2020 SRC group hadn't been idle. Their Age Managers, Kirsty Allen and Karen Cormack with their parent water safety helpers Mark Tickle, Damien Underwood and Matt Watson,

had been working on their fitness and wet training since the start of the season. After a break over Xmas Emmanuel commenced their intensive wet and dry training. This group of 14 SRC had their wet and dry assessment on Bilgola Beach on the 17th of April. Challenging conditions, including a difficult shore dump and strong current, didn't deter them and all 14 were deemed proficient on the day. As they finished so late in the season, they didn't get their uniforms or patrol allocation but this will all be rectified at the start of next season.

CADETS

The remainder of our 2018 SRC group were also busy this season training for their Bronze Medallion. Thanks for filling in for me lads, couldn't of happened without you. David Madew also deserves a special mention, making himself available every Sunday morning to take an IRB out the back to bolster our water safety ratios.

Cadets Madison Perry and Luca Parsanejad were this years Bilgola nominees for the Junior Life Saver of the Year Program. Our nominees took part in a Life Saving Workshop an interactive day which includes feedback on SRC process, interview techniques leading into the SNB and SLSNSW interviews, getting to know your peers whilst having a fun day filled with jet skis, drones, duty officers and much more. Although unsuccessful at branch level Madison and Luca reflect the core image & principles of surf lifesaving and will be future leaders in our club. Well done Madison and Luca we are very proud of you.

CADET AWARDS

Not only do our Cadets help with water safety but they also help with nipper groups. This particular cohort of cadets went above and beyond this season and the Juniors Committee were unanimous in their approval of their nomination. 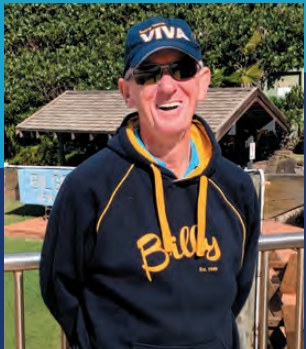

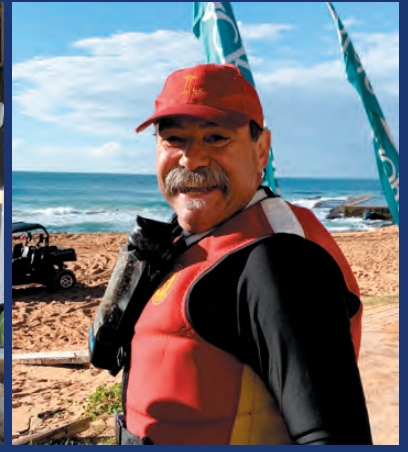



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, Charitable Fundraising Act (NSW), Associations Incorporation Act and Australian Accounting Standards Board and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

Membership fees

Membership fees received in advance of the current year will be brought to account as income in the appropriate year.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Taxes

Under the tax system, the Club was endorsed on 1 July 2000 by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) as an income tax exempt entity.

Fringe Benefits Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, was exempt from Fringe Benefits Tax under *Section 57A of the Fringe Benefits Assessment Act 1986*. No fringe benefits were paid as the Club did not employ staff during the reportable period.

Capital Gains Tax

The Club, as a public benevolent institution, is exempt from Capital Gains Tax under *Section 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

No provision is required for income tax as the Club's income is exempt.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021

Property

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation.

Property Leasehold Improvements, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the club during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of the recognition of the liability.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and cessation of all involvement in those goods.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue from fund raisings, donations, grants/subsidies, sponsorships is recognised at fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account the period of commitment. Income is recognized on accruals basis which is at the point income is committed, not received.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

Contingent Liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities that the committee members are aware of that will have material effects to the financial report.

Events Subsequent To Reporting Date

Since the end of the financial year, there are no material events that have come to the attention of the committee members that will have material impact on the financial report.

Financial Risk Management

The club's financial instruments consists mainly of deposits with banks, short-term investments, accounts receivable and payable.

Financial Risk Management Policies

The association treasurer's overall risk management strategy seeks to assist the club in meeting its financial targets, whilst minimising potential adverse effects on financial performance.

Risk management policies are approved and reviewed by the members committee on a regular basis. These included the credit risk policies and future cash flow requirements.

The main purpose of non-derivative financial instruments is to raise finance for company operations. The club does not have any derivative instruments.





Report on the Financial Report

The financial report has been prepared to assist the organisation to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
